ADI DEV BRAHMA

with it the sweet memories of Brahma Baba who, on this day, in the year 1969, left his mortal coil and took the angelic form as to work, side - by- side with Shiv Baba, for the spiritual rejuvenation of mankind without any physical and worldly bondage.

The year 1936-37 had proved a turning point in the life of Baba. Until then, he had been doing diamond and jewel business in Calcutta, Bombay and Karachi and had also been worshipping Shri Narayan, studying the Gita and attending religious congregations. But in the year 1936, when he was a

little less than sixty years, he became more introvert and practised spiritual contemplation more devotedly.

Baba had divine visions and 'Surrendered' to God

During this period, he had a number of divine visions. One of these was about the forthcoming destruction of the present Iron-aged world. Baba saw, in that vision, the world shaking badly because of severe earthquakes, certain continents burning and going deep down under the water because of nuclear catastrophe and a lot of blood being spilt in India because of communal frenzy. Baba felt terrified and

saddened. He then had a vision of the new, coming world order of *Satyuga* or Golden Age when there will be prefect law and order and love and unity and purity, peace and prosperity. Baba was ordained by the Divine to be His corporeal medium for the re-

establishment of *Satyuga* – the era of world peace. Baba willingly and immediately surrendered all his worldly belongingness and his physical, corporeal medium to Shiv Baba, became the founding father of Brahma Kumaris Institution.

Prototype of a Dev and unlike the 'gurus'

Baba was unlike the saints and founders-of-religions of the past and the gurus and 'god men' of the present. Incorporeal God Shiva had given him the name Prajapita Brahma because through him the whole world was to be spiritually created. He was also known as Adi Dev of the future, Golden-aged world. By practising intense and loveful meditation, Baba completely enlightened, purified and divinised but he now has the rare privilege of working in union and unison with God Shiva from this realm of angels for the good of mankind.

Baba's contribution to understanding life and cosmos

If we evaluate a person's life in terms of his noble actions and the service he did to the mankind, and if we assess a person's creativity and mental life by taking into account what ideas he contributed to the understanding of the cosmos in

general and the human life in particular, or what he did towards enhancing the value of life and bringing peace to the strife-torn world, then Baba's life stands out supreme. Baba did so much in all these realms as none else has ever done. Shiv Baba explained through him what was, heretofore, a deep mystery. He gave many deepest facts of life. Man's understanding of the self, of God and of the Universe was never before so clear as he made it now, nor had the ideal of a virtuous and holy life been so clearly set unto mankind as Baba did it now. None had earlier been able to say anything final on the questions of the form of the universe, the duration of the World Cycle, the origin and the end of the World History, the goal of human life, the nature of the self and its relationship with God, the source of Thought and the method of controlling or divinising it. Shiv Baba through His corporeal medium-Brahma Baba had touched on topics of eternal and the timeless interest and he made the pursuit of this knowledge worthwhile. Heretofore, only provisional theories had been offered by sages of the yore or thinkers of the present but Baba set on many new facts a seal of finality. He imparted definitive knowledge on those questions which had stirred the chord of curiosity in man. Now there remained no vagueness, doubt, mystery or ambiguity about them. Everything was as clear as a crystal.

Discovery of new continents of thought and islands of truth

It is a rare fact of history that revelations of Baba have not only received the attention of common people but they have impinged on the learned people also. Their influence has overflowed into very much wider areas and indeed they have ramified beyond the field of scholarship into the field of science and the sphere of public affairs. What Baba explained is not being highly appreciated by physicists, astronomers, geologists, scholars of history, philosophy and aesthetics, practitioners, medical neurologists, psychiatrists, psychologists, jurists and eminent men of other disciplines. He has made a deep imprint on civilisation and culture, nay; he has given it a new direction.

Anyone who studies impartially God's revelations made through Baba, he will reach the conclusion that his work led him to many new

discoveries - discoveries of new continents of Thought which were no less important than the discovery of America by Columbus or India by Vasco-de-Gama. Baba's voyages into meditation and his sojourn in spiritual thought have given to man the knowledge of many new islands of truth. If we ask the question whether a man who has chosen to dedicate his life to the pursuit of knowledge qua knowledge and to ideas qua ideas, ever made an impact on the minds of the men in general, Baba's life would provide the answer that ideas do travel from the meditation hall of a Rajyogi over the wide world around.

But this should not give the impression that Baba was an ivory-tower thinker, philosopher or theoretician. No. He was practical without doubt. He first practised and only then preached. He had no value for mere theories that were not practised or that brought stillness in life. He himself was so dynamic. He gave religion and spiritualism new dynamism and vigour.

Man of myriad qualities

He was spontaneous and required no study or preparation for his lectures. He gave anecdotes and quoted practical instances to explain various

philosophical or knotty points. His wealth of knowledge and understanding was truly amazing; it was seemingly inexhaustible. Solutions to problems occurred to him at the spur of the moment. He kept his audience deeply absorbed and interested. He was frank, witty and fearless. There were no taboos in his mind. The clear light of his reason swept away every doubt and ill-feeling. His anecdotes of 'The frogs croaking', 'The monkeys yelling', 'The sheep convention', etc., brought smiles or peels of laughter. He had the wonderful sense of good proportion that comes with good humour. He nudged more people into self-realisation and purification with a sweet smile, a healthy joke or a kind look than were ever forced in through fear and long-faced piety. He expressed himself fearlessly even on topics which another man would consider sensitive. He was un-phased by any event or happening so far as his daily discourse and meditation class was concerned.

As ideal Godly student

He was able to impart the words of profound wisdom – this despite the fact that he did not have much formal education. Perhaps, this proved an asset,

for his mind received no indoctrination and false conditioning and had no vanity of being a highly educated man or a scholar. He always considered himself a student – a Godly student. He happily said: "Godly student life is the best." He was an ideal Godly student, for he followed God's teachings wholeheartedly and sincerely.

He was not like an orangeclad or saffron dressed guru, selling a short-cut to Liberation or a recipe for meditation in Indian metropolis or in foreign countries by making jaunts in jumbo-jets. He did not believe in the philosophy of being tucked away in the bowels of the red wood forests, besides a stream, away from all. In fact, he disapproved all this and advised to be natural. He was a practical World Teacher. He knew that the salvation of an individual would not solve the problem, for the whole world is in agony and is crying in pain. He, therefore, worked for the purification of one and all.

He considered critics as friends

Purity and Meditation, knowledge and virtue were his main lamps of life. He was an embodiment of tolerance, compassion and forgiveness. His opponents relentlessly tried to malign him but he never allowed hate to enter into his mind. He wished all people well and considered his critics to be his friends, for they drew his attention to certain points and thus kept him on the alert.

Baba's main lesson and message

His main lesson is pithily expressed in his last discourse which he delivered on the night of 18th January, 1969. He asked man to become Nirakari, Nirvikari and Nirahankari, i.e. incorporeal soul, and to be viceless and above all, to give up all pride, ego and body-consciousness. He further asked to have loveful and conscious link with God, for that alone is capable of absolving the soul of all its rust of past moral deformities, and of eradicating all sorrows and sufferings.

Baba's message was the message of love, compassion and universal brotherhood of man, under the Fatherhood of God. His this method has brought real integration among people of different races, nationalities, castes and creeds and has given hope and peace to the agony-stricken world.

His formula for health

The cardinal rule of health professed by him was: "Lead a pious and carefree life, firmly

established in the belief in the non-violable law of Karma or the set plan of the world drama, be calm and contented; train yourself in the habit of meeting emergence with calmness, never giving way to brooding and worry. And it is very important that you avoid, as poisonous and suicidal, anger, fear, gluttony and sex-lust.

His method and aim of work

Baba had proper blending of harmony and balance with functionality. He had a strong sense of direction. Whatever he did, he did methodically, resolutely and with a purpose. Type was his forte. Whatever he did was for the general welfare. There was no selfish motive behind it. Baba always wanted to give and to bless. He tried to bestow good luck on all by inspiring them to engage themselves into good action. He considered all as his spiritual children and always felt happy to see them rise as a teacher or father feels happy when his students or children rise in life.

The value he gave to Time

He understood the value of time as no one else did. He often explained how this particular life, being last in the World-cycle, is valuable and how time, usefully spent in spiritual endeavour and in

service of mankind can give us a happy future for twenty-five centuries. "Our present body", he said, "though, born of sexlust can be a very useful instrument for raising ourselves to be deities." He, therefore, advised one and all to take care of the body as God's property and as a trust and to do no evil, hear no evil and see no evil through it, for God will not give to man a thing for being misused. However, when it was time for doing Godly service, he counselled all not to say 'No', for Baba would help one with a healthy feeling if one would happily devote the self to service.

Flights into the spaceships of Godly remembrance

Baba was a man of infinite charm. His words could achieve miracles greater than man's going into space or landing on the moon. He could inspire souls to counteract the forces of worldly attraction and also the pull of the body and to fly beyond space, mentally, into the Soul World. He called this as Yad Ki Yatra - Mind's pilgrimage into world of God on the spaceship of intense love for and remembrance of God. The souls could do this easily through a moment before they had considered this 'impossible'. Baba did not believe in miracles

nor did he consider the materialisation of ashes or watches etc., by means of occult powers, a good thing. He called this 'pai-paise ki cheez' – a worthless achievement, for it gave man no lasting benefit. He emphasised that unless man purified the self by means of God's knowledge and loveful meditation, he could never attain any lasting and noble result.

He loved and used art for elevation of mankind

Baba's aesthetic tastes and sense of appreciation were highly developed. He used music during meditation and interpreted songs to give a start and a touch of art to his discourses. He sometimes said that the songs were the Gita. He appreciated poetry. In the early days of the institution, he even composed some songs so as to be recited by the spiritual children. Yet he considered silence as superior to songs and, gradually, led the children into soundless stage. In fact, he had great love for all fine arts. He wanted these to be used for the elevation of souls. He understood how effective these could be in conveying Godly message in an interesting way. He instructed for making good paintings of Godly knowledge illustrations, charts and all. He pointed out that arts have the

potentialities to raise man to spiritual heights and these have also the capability for bringing man's downfall. He, therefore, wanted man to see that, in the name of beauty, there was no vulgarity and that beauty was blended with goodness, that *Sundram* was accompanied by a wish for Shivam.

A Pillar of strength and tower of light

Above all, he was the greatest Rajyogi of all times. Anyone, who sat in this presence, experienced peace and withdrawal from the body. There was divine grace in his acts. He radiated vibrations of spiritual calmness. He had attained the mental quietude and constancy under situations of stress and in face of

vicissitudes. He was noblehearted and had become, by means of practice of intense meditation, a powerhouse from which a great multitude of men, women and children drew their spiritual strength.

In the strife-torn world, he brought peace to many homes, hopes to many dejected souls, spiritual strength to those who considered themselves too weak to attain worthy goals of purity, and he blessed many souls with the gift of selfrealisation and happiness. He is now doing this divine work in the angelic form of Avyakt Brahma. He and Shiv Baba, who are in constant company, are together called Bap-Dada. If poet Rabindra Nath Tagore were alive today, he would pay his homage in these words:

O serene, O Free,

In thine immeasurable mercy and goodness

Wipe away all dark stains from the heart of the earth. Man's heart is anguished with the fever of unrest With the poison of self-seeking,

With a thirst that knows no evil.

Countries far and wide flaunt on their foreheads
The blood-red mark of hatred.

Touch them with thy right hand,

Make them one in spirit, Bring harmony into their life,

Bring rhythm of beauty. ■

CALL OF TIME – STRICTLY FOLLOW FATHER

e all know how the transformation of one individual has led to the transformation of about nine lakh people in the world at present. Perhaps, the transformation may not be to cent per cent level, but the transformation has taken place and has been going on at a faster pace. This process of transformation has come to convince all of us that the world is decisively poised for a major positive transformation in the near future.

We also know that various religions were established by different prophets at different times. They nowhere mentioned that they had come to establish religions. Their thoughts took shape in the form of a religion not during their life time, but much later. But, here the transformational process is given lot of emphasis to carve out better human beings through regular study. The teacher is the Lord Himself. This fact has been announced in advance and has been repeated time and again which makes all the difference. Even though the

force behind the transformation is that of the Lord, but real efforts have to be made by the spiritual aspirants. God, as the teacher of humankind has been teaching us, but it is our responsibility to study.

God Shiva selected Brahma Baba as the right student to have access to the lessons on self-transformation because of his higher qualities among the multitude of human beings in the world. Brahma Baba occupies the unique position for being the corporeal father of humanity. Therefore, the studies to become the real Brahma- the Brahma Dev. as has been named and recorded in the scriptures, assumes unprecedented potential and significance. Brahma Baba set an example for other students to follow. His life and his words of wisdom remind us of his sterling qualities which enabled him to become the first student of the Lord and ultimately the best student in the history of the world. Similarly, he became the first and the best godly servant of the Lord. His actions always projected the Lord to the world

and not himself.

The ascension day of Brahma Baba celebrated every year on 18th January gives us an opportunity to relocate our position of spiritual endeavour and resolve resolutely to catch up with him. Here is a bird's eye view of his efforts and his attainments.

Brahma Baba was in search of the Lord, greater wisdom and higher life. When he received the first divine vision itself, he started constructively pondering over the reality. He started receiving the teachings in good faith, not raising any questions. He came to discriminate and judge the teachings in their right perspective. He was able to perceive and realise the truth that God had descended on him and was teaching him. He came to have the highest regard for the Lord and also for His teachings. Therefore, he implemented the directions of the Lord on a day-to-day basis. Excited, intoxicated and thrilled, he firmly believed that he was going to be the praiseworthy and worshipworthy Shri Narayan in the Golden Age in his next birth.

Brahma Baba came to be a great thinker and practitioner of Godly knowledge. His thoughts were like a fast flowing river. The delivery was fast, with lot

of contents that generated power and enlightenment. Each and every word had its own value, for which there was no parallel in any of the world's literature. He followed the teachings in letter and spirit. He would wake up at amritvela, early in the morning, and others also followed him. He was a tapasvi-brahmarishi to the very core. He never missed the class because he was aware that he himself would be the first beneficiary of the teachings. He made himself available to the Lord for conducting the class, irrespective of his being physically fit or otherwise.

He had set specific time for practising soul-consciousness though he remained aware of his own soul-conscious existence at all times. He had set specific time for churning Godly knowledge and separate time for conversing with the Lord and practising subtle existence and traversing to the subtle regions, experiencing the angelic stage. Due to this practice, he was able to show to the world the effect of soulconsciousness. People used to see his eyes as two powerful bulbs burning with spiritual light. Similarly, people had the vision of a shining star in between his eyebrows. They also had the vision of the Lord while looking

into his eyes. Many people had practically seen a crown of light on his head. Those with bad intentions and vicious propensities got transformed when he simply looked at them. When trans-messengers used to go to the Subtle World, they would see Brahma in his complete form in the subtle region. He had similarly set time for karmana seva-service through action. He had personally performed all types of karma and set an example for others to follow wherein he combined yoga with action. He even demonstrated that while playing also one can be in yoga.

Brahma Baba had none else to follow who had earlier treaded such spiritual path. But, the enlightenment bestowed by the Lord prepared him to dedicate himself-samarpanhis body, mind, and wealth-in favour of God's mission. It was adventure-with difference, something nobody else had ever done before. He did not think what was going to happen to him tomorrow, what would happen to his family and what the world would think of his course of action and so on.

His courage and dedication led to innumerable individual tests as well as general tests while administering or managing this unique spiritual institution. His unlimited patience and tolerance in the face of mud-slinging, personal vilification, criticism, picketing, murderous attempts, court cases, media ire, replenished unlimited spiritual power within himself to fulfil all affairs of God's mission with renewed force.

In the midst of the opposition and mudslinging Brahma Baba was not disturbed, instead, he generated lot of good wishes and pure feelings for such souls. He had unstinted faith in the Lord and he followed the Shrimat (elevated directions of the Almighty) in letter and spirit. He had deeper conviction that these were side-scenes on the way to a higher goal. The goal would be reached at any cost at the right time, as the leader is the Lord. He had firm faith in the consequence of his actions. He had an attitude of instrumentality and constructiveness in the face of fierce opposition, unfavourable situations and circumstances. He had no ill-will towards anybody. He looked at everyone as his child, irrespective of the fact that he was in his favour or was a sworn enemy.

Brahma Baba's spiritual endeavours began after 60 years of his physical age. He was a natural *tapaswi* whether in action or in rest. He was not a time-conscious yogi but always combined *karma* and yoga. That was why he could attain the angelic stage. His life was a mirror in which others could easily see and experience the spiritual fragrance of bodiless, egoless and viceless levels of life.

Brahma Baba's slogan was, "Whatever I do, others will observe and follow me; let I be cautious and watch how I think, speak and behave". This was a great lesson which transformed many lives. He had proved that while performing ordinary actions, one could give the experience of being a worship-worthy image. His language was alokik and not ordinary. 'Son shows father' is a common adage being used by the Lord. Brahma Baba was an epitome of this adage. His actions, behaviour and face automatically revealed the Father. He was highly simple yet spiritual to the core. His speech, behaviour, actions and interaction with others had divine touch.

He knew in advance as to when he was going to leave his mortal coil. The time of his departure from this mundane world was known to him in advance and that is why he had decided as to who were to be present at the final hour. He left his body on his own volition with prior knowledge, as has been taught by the Lord. The Lord - our Supreme Teacher is very emphatic and particular that all of us should leave our mortal coil on our own volition. Brahma Baba was the first Godly student to become complete and attain perfection, as taught by Supreme Father Shiva. Thus, he rightfully attains the sovereignty of the forthcoming Golden Age. ■

He was also affectionately called Dada Lekhraj.

To possess virtues but to possess all virtues in their full and complete abundance and ability to manage with proper balance in a befitting manner, are the indications of a great mind and these lift the man almost to the level of the Divine.

As his life was full of integrity and humility, he was chosen as a befitting instrument to serve as corporeal medium of the Highest Soul of all, God, for His incarnation and descent on planet earth and in India in particular.

Above all, Brahma Baba's uniqueness was not merely in possessing the highest virtues but about his ability to bring out those virtues in the souls with whom he came into contact. When he turned sixty years of age, he had a deep divine urge for self-realisation as well as God-realisation. He started utilising more and more of his time in contemplation and thinking. He wanted to fully understand the mysteries of the Universe. He developed an irresistible yearning for union with the Supreme.

It was at that stage of development in Dadaji's life that God, the Supreme Soul, chose to incarnate into the body of Dada Lekhraj (as the Supreme Soul is beyond birth and death, i.e. *Ajanma*). This was as per the promise mentioned in Bhagvat Gita, Chapter 4, Slokas

STORY OF A NOBLE SOUL, SAINT AND ANGEL

he story of this great doyen dates back to more than 72 years. The globe owes indebtedness to such a saint, angel and a great human being, who struggled till his last breath for the upliftment of society. Born in 1876 in Sindh (now in Pakistan) he treaded the path of humanity, selflessness and altruism when the globe had been devastated by two World Wars. Brahma Baba, usually known as Dada Lekhraj, was a very prosperous diamond

merchant, who led a very simple, devout and contented life, as any normal person. Despite the wealth and luxuries around him, he was always free from ego. He left all luxuries and donated his everything one fine day for the sake of society around him. He was one who dreamt always for the weakest segments of the society. He was sociable to all, from a beggar to an officer, a prisoner to a jailer, a servant to a master and so on. Because of this kind of endearment, he was called Dada (elder brother), who became Dada Lekhraj later on.

He meandered through the darkest tunnels of misery, hardship, opposition and various other obstacles for creating a wave of spirituality and happiness in the lives of humanity across the globe. Through his meditation, he solved many obstacles and mundane problems which came his way.



He had great reverence for and unflinching faith in God. Because of his spiritual strength, he would kick all the fears that used to come his way. Through his strong meditative power, he became the human medium of the Almighty. After the descent of God into his body, he was given a new name, Prajapita Brahma, or Adi Dev (the first deity). Later, it became new term, Brahma Baba. By this he inculcated an inspiration to create a spiritual institution named Om Mandali. By that, millions got benefitted and a spiritual atmosphere developed everywhere.

The two words 'dependence' and 'failure' could never occupy the dictionary of this great soul. Not only did he cremate these two, but also asked the entire

world and his students to erase these words from their books. Slowly from Om Mandali, through his great endeavour, it became Prajapita Brahma Ishwariya Kumaris Vishwa Vidyalaya. He had bright students who have been the strong pillars of this spiritual organisation, e.g., Jagdamba Saraswati (Mamma), Dadi Prakashmani, Dadi Nirmal Shanta (Daughter of Brahma Baba), Gulzar

Dadi (Baba's chariot) and Janki Dadi (also known as Pavan Putra Hanuman because of her never tiring and flying activities), and so on. In 1950, the Headquarters of Prajapita Brahma Kumaris Ishwariya Vishwa Vidyalaya moved to serene and green surroundings of Aravali Hills in Mount Abu, Rajasthan. Brahma Baba, assisted by Dadis, B.K. brothers and sisters, accomplished this spiritual task. Presently there are about 8,500 centres across the globe, doing wonderful services for spiritual and social upliftment of humanity.

The only motto of this Godly university is that none should be left without getting Godly knowledge so that our society is totally free from all kinds of negativity, e.g., Lust, Anger, Greed, Attachment, Ego, Jealousy etc. These negativities have totally handicapped our society, desiccating peace. The main teaching is that God is not omnipresent; He resides in Paramdham and meditation is the only way to reach Him. ATTACHMENT

ttachment is like a disease for the aspirants on spiritual path. It is an acquired habit. When a child is born, first he develops his love and attachment towards his mother and then towards his father. Slowly, attachment towards other relations—brother, sister, friend, aunt and uncle is developed. He calls them "mine".

Attachment is different from spiritual love. Mother is the primary caretaker of a child. The child requires consistent loving response to his needs for food, sleep and comfort. It is the process of bonding between the child and primary caretaker – the mother. As the child grows, so does the bond of trust with the mother. This is the love which has a lifelong effect on growth, development, trust and relationship. It is the duty of the parents to give love and affection to the children so that they may grow to be the human beings with divine qualities. But love is converted to attachment if too much bodily love is given.

For any small illness, if the mother cries throughout the night, gives a sleepless night to others, then it is attachment. Sometimes the father wants that his son should be an engineer, but the child has no inclination towards science or engineering, then tug of war between the father and son starts which may continue further. This is the attachment of the father which he should avoid and allow his son a freedom of choice.

The attachment towards materials also attracts him. He claims "It is my home; my scooter; my car". Once he thinks 'mine', the attachment increases. In a lifespan of a few years, one hundred and thousand things are attached to life. He forgets that his body is not his own, it is given to him by his parents. Also when he departs from this world, he leaves his bodily apron here. All the materials as well as relations are left behind in this world. Therefore, it is said that "You have come with bare hands and you have to go empty handed." Alexander, the Great, before his death had asked his friends that when he would die, they should take his body through his kingdom with both of his hands open and empty indicating that Alexander, the Great had conquered the whole world, but he could not take anything with him when he died.

Attachment turns love into fear and peace into anger. It distorts our attitude and action towards others and blocks our divine energy from radiation. To get rid of attachment, it is necessary to shed bodyconsciousness and to remain soul-conscious. Bodyconsciousness brings waste thoughts that waste our precious time. It is necessary to check the self up to what extent you have controlled your thoughts. Even ordinary thoughts cannot make you free from attachment. By simple walking one can reach the goal late, but by flying one can reach in a twinkle of eye. Ordinary thought can make one tired; one cannot enjoy the beauty of flying, the green firmament and soothing air. It is said that idle mind is devil's workshop. Therefore, one should have powerful thoughts. He should remember that it is the Confluence Age where the blessing and guidance of Almighty Supreme Father are available at hand. Our thoughts should be embedded with divine

love and positive attitude so that waste thoughts can be deleted.

Regarding time, Supreme Father says that a fraction of a second in this Confluence Age is equivalent to one year in the world cycle. It is also said that time and tides wait for none. As everyone knows that if a student does not prepare well for his examination, he has to lose one year. If an athlete in Olympic game is trailed by a fraction of millisecond, he cannot win the Gold medal. Time is so precious that one should not waste it. One should remain soul-conscious while performing actions in drama, acquiring divine virtues, and keeping in view the secrets of karma.

The spider procreates the net, but it becomes imprisoned in its own net and dies in that net as it cannot come out from the net it procreated. Attachment is like the net, once engrossed in attachment, one cannot come out of that and cannot walk on spiritual path.

Attachment to one's relatives or any articles, cloth or food makes one's life immensely sorrowful. Reality of life will come to the forefront when the demise of some near and dear ones would occur due to accident or disease. The mental bond between two persons causes the attachment and they

join in the three-legged race. They cannot win the race and the beauty of life is lost in the desert. Attachment towards the caste and community or language or nation causes the people to divide themselves into the fighting fractions and thereby making the whole world as a boiling cauldron.

But all these are called attachments which work like the AIDS in the spiritual uplift. All know what AIDS is. It is a dreaded disease—Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome. An estimated 32.7 million people are now living with this dreaded disease worldwide and World Health Organisation has reported that AIDS has killed more than 25 million people since it was first recognised on June 5, 1981 making it most destructive epidemic in recorded history. In 2005 alone, AIDS claimed an estimated 2.4-3.3 million lives, of which 570,000 were children. This disease spreads through the virus named Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV). When a patient comes to know that he is suffering from this disease, he counts the days for his burial in the coffin. Life seems to him of no value; it may be asserted that he dies from the very day he hears about this disease. Though

antiretroviral treatment, medication may delay the death, it remains only a hope against hope for survival.

Attachments of various sorts gradually detract the spiritual aspirant from the spiritual path. Neither can he concentrate, nor can he meditate on Supreme Soul. All these empty him inside. When he sits for meditation, first the bodily relations will be flashed in his mind's eyes and then the material which he loves most will come to his intellect. He may seat in the lotus seat, but the time he spends goes in vain. Neither his time is successful nor are vices through meditation destroyed. He may claim to be a yogi of 40 years, but the loads of vices still are on the head. As in AIDS, the virus eats away the strength, power and vigour of the man moment: every these attachments also eat away the power of soul day-by-day. Mind is hollow; intellect is filled with "me and mine." What he has promised to Supreme Soul that he will offer his body, mind and wealth on Godly service are forgotten. His attachment towards body and money distance him from spiritual goal. He even does not get any time for self introspection. He becomes the prisoner of his own deeds like the spider.

A South Indian story appropriately describes how greed and attachment cause a monkey to be the prisoner. The people cut a small hole in a coconut just large enough for a monkey to put its hand in. Next they fix the cocoanut in the tree


and fill it with a sweet. The monkey smells the sweet and finds that its fist does not fit through the hole. The last thing the monkey will think of is to let go of the sweet and it holds itself prisoner. Nothing could be easier for human beings who

come and catch it.

Let us shed the chain of attachment which is the barrier on the spiritual path and get light and might in this Age of Confluence and valiantly tread this spiritual path.

INTERVENTION VERSUS MEDITATION

r. David Eddie, Professor of cardiac surgery, Stanford University, devised a virtual model, Archimedes model of human body with all of its physiological processes for assessing the value of different interventions. The results were baffling to the Scientist mind. Trillions of dollars spent on the interventions increased the life expectancy by only 3%. The rest came from sanitation, proper nutrition, proper sleep and a tranquil state of mind. Ability to sustain a tranquil, peaceful state under all lifecircumstances comes from meditation.

Today the highly intelligent mind has more faith in science than in the faith itself. He believes more in logical essays than in belief and faith. He believes in the techniques of satisfying pleasures more than in love. A demand for scientific proof for everything, even for the existence of GOD, is the legacy of the scientist mind. The Spiritualist mind functions on belief and faith. Susan

Kobassa's hardiness concept in AIDS, and the placebo and nosebo-effects in therapy add strength to the belief that even mere faith can move the mountain and bring miracles. In fact, neuroscience has shown that a strong belief and faith that nothing can go wrong with my body or with my worldly affairs activate some hitherto unknown healing-mechanisms in our body. They bring about a miracle of impossible cures or maintain good health under impossible situations. They awaken an inner giant which provides easy solutions to impossible apparently **problems.** Scientist mind simply cannot believe this because the man has forgotten that he is a BMSO, Car manufactured by the Supreme Creator Shiv Baba. BMSO has four main components - body, mind, soul and organism. So at every step of progress in medical science, a man knows only a little more than what he already knew. History of Medicine reveals that the progress in science takes the man from areas of

greater errors to those of lesser errors; but whatever the stage of progress, an area always remains unknown to him. This is the **DOMAIN** of the Supreme Surgeon, Shiv Baba, where miracles happen through remembrance or meditation. Not long ago, a lymphocyte was regarded as a phlegmatic spectator gathering at the periphery of an inflammatory focus, watching the intense life and death battle between invading bacteria and defending polymorphs. The same lymphocyte became a revered Brigadier after the discovery of powerful interleukins. Human body harbours so many such wonders which become revealed to man at a precise preordained point of time according to the most precise Divine Plan. Saying 'I discovered it' is meaningless. It was preordained to be discovered. 'God gets things done as acts Himself forms the point of light and He is ocean of virtues' (Karan karavanhaar Ek Baba Hai Jo Roop Mein Bindu (Point) Lekin Guno Mein Sindhu Hai). In fact, whole of human body shall become functionless and pointless without the existence of several points - Supreme soul, drama and soul. The receptors are the points where bacteria and viruses,

hormones and enzymes or the antibiotics or antibodies interact to produce the related effects. Days are not far off when the knowledge about the points or receptorology shall replace all varieties of logics like cardiology or diabetology to provide a permanent cure in all the four-dimensions of health.

Patanjali Kriya yoga, which has been integral Indian yoga for around 2500 years, promises conquest of ageing and diseases by regular practice. This yoga consists of yama, niyam, asana, pranayam, dhyan, dharana, pratyahaar and Samadhi. This Sadhana requires nearly two hours, an impossible luxury for the Extremely Busy Persons (E.B.P.) of today. Supreme Surgeon Shiv Baba made every thing easy and deleted the difficult Hath-Yoga from Sadhana. Dhyan (Meditation), Dharana (inculcating values and shrimat) and selftransformation came into focus. Today meditation has become a scientific technique for cure and maintaining health. It is no more a matter of mere belief and faith. Dr. Richard Davidson, professor of psychiatry, Wisconsin University, has termed Dhyan as mindfulness meditation. Long ago, when the medical

profession functioned under a gross illusion of "The Cause and Effect Theory" created by the great microbiologists like Louis Pasteur and Robert Koch, Hippocrates, the father of modern medicine, compelled to warn the medical profession "of the greatest error today is that the physicians do not take soul into account for therapy." Today, the medical profession is committing the same mistake. So, in spite of magical discoveries, the different diseases are on the rise and assuming pandemic proportions. Somehow the different centric strategies are not directed towards the root cause, the mind. The great wheel of time has turned a full circle and an ancient Indian concept of holistic health and intrinsic healing, has appeared on the horizon in the form of Soul-Mind-Body-Medicine. Negative thoughts which cause disease of the soul translate into various diseases of the body. They sap and leak the 'pranik energy' from the soul and have become the potent weapons for selfdestruction. Today lust, anger, greed, ego, hatred and repulsion have joined forces with stress, tension, anxiety, worry, fear and frustration for the destruction of the mankind. Anger or frustrations are two predominant toxic emotions two hours before a heart attack. Stressful state of mind brings about a lethal and destructive TH-2 immune response in tuberculosis. On the other hand, a 'Happy State of Mind' brings about healing TH-1 immune response. That is why Supreme Surgeon, Shiv Baba tells us, " khushi Jaisi Khurak Nahi (There is no diet better than happiness)." So remain happy under all circumstances. The strength for achieving such a stable and unshakeable state of mind can be derived only bv remembrance meditation.

There are more than 200 types of meditation that are available today, in this era of mass-confusion called extreme Kaliyuga. Some of them come in costly commercial packages. But Supreme Surgeon Shiv Baba, Who is ocean of love for us children, has come to us from Incorporeal World to give us knowledge, free of cost, about a simple three-step technique which is both laboratory-proven and easy. The blocks in heart vessels have disappeared in C.A.Dregression project in more than 4000 cases. The first step involves focusing our consciousness on



Melatonin controls sleep-wake cycle and cures insomnia. Brain-Derived-Neurotrophic Factor (B.D.N.F.) gives the miracle of neuro-genesis and provides cure for depression. It may be the answer for Alzheimer's and other forms of dementia or memory loss including that due to ageing. The dictum in newer

branches of medicine, Psychoneuro-endocrino-immunology and psycho-oncology says that the incurable disease means whose cure lies within. That is why our Supreme Creator Shiv Baba promises in His Murlis "If we remove the rust on soul through yoga power, then we will become everhealthy, ever wealthy and ever happy. The third step is Cosmic Communion in which we, the souls, talk to our SUPREME CREATOR in an soul to Supreme Soul trans-personal transaction, just as is mentioned in Ken Wilbur's "Transpersonal psychology".

The Supreme Surgeon also cautions us against having any doubts about what He is telling through His *Murlis*. So let your meditation be regular; all of your doubts and fears shall disappear miraculously.

THE HINDU TRINITY OF BRAHMA, VISHNU AND SHANKAR

he picture of Trimurti God Shiva captures the three divine acts of God Shiva when He fulfils His promise in Gita c 4 v 7&8 that when there is unrighteousness and lawlessness in the world, He will descend and embody himself to protect the virtuous, destroy the evil and re-establish a pure Golden-aged world of righteousness (dharma).

God Shiva, the Supreme Soul, is beyond the cycle of birth and death, nor does He take birth through a mother, as do human beings. He is not subjected to the bondage of actions (karma) or physical experiences of the world (Abhokta). God says in Gita c9v11 "Fools, not knowing my supreme nature, think low of Me, the Lord of creation who have put on the human body. That is, they take me, who have appeared in human garb through my Yogamaya for the deliverance of the world, to be an ordinary mortal". (Also See Gita c7v24-25; c8v9 &c10 v3).

Today, people are confused

as God Shiva, the incorporeal bodiless One (*Nirakaar*), the point of light shown at the top of the picture, has been inadvertently or innocently omitted from the Hindu Trinity and only Brahma (creator), Vishnu (Sustainer) and Shankar (transformer) are shown.

God Shiva and His Three Divine Acts

1. The first divine act of God Shiva is to embody Himself by using the body of Brahma to impart the knowledge of the Shrimat Bhagavad Gita to destroy the five vices – lust, anger, greed, attachment and ego. These five evils are known as Ravan, Satan or Shaitan. Deity Brahma is one aspect of God's three divine acts and should not be confused with the word "Brahm" which is the sixth element of light that pervades Nirvana (Brahmlok), the supreme abode of God. Brahma is known as the "special son" of Heavenly God Father Shiva because he surrendered mind, body and wealth towards the establishment of the new world

order of the Golden age. For this, Brahma is known as the master creator and called 'Bhagirath', the lucky chariot. The picture in the Gita of Arjuna in the chariot with God holding the reins of the five horses is the memorial of this auspicious event, hence the name the 'lucky chariot'.

An important aspect of Brahma in Gita c9 v1 quote "To you, who are devoid of the carping spirit, I shall now unfold the knowledge of Nirguna Brahma along with the knowledge of Sakara Brahma by knowing which you will be freed from the evil of worldly existence".

Sakar Brahma in the above verse is Prajapita Brahma in his earthly human form and role whereas Nirguna Brahma is his angelic (Aakar) role as Adi Dev Brahma in a subtle body of light residing in the angelic world. The Gita in c9v2 says that this knowledge of Brahma is a sovereign science, a sovereign secret, supremely holy, most excellent, directly enjoyable, attended with virtues, very easy to practise and imperishable.

The Spiritual Meaning of "Brahma Astra"

In ancient warfare, the *Brahm Astra* is a missile said to be set in motion by divine force. It is an unfailing weapon that hits and destroys its target.

It was the *Brahma Astra* that was used by Ram to completely destroy (burn and cremate) Ravan when all other missiles could only make Ravan unconscious, giving Ravan a chance to get up and attack again. In the path of knowledge, the *Brahma Astra* is not a physical weapon, but it is the combined might of *Gyan* and *Yoga* of the Gita to destroy the vices and the evils of the world.

2. The second divine act is the role of Shankar as the form of perfection of soulconsciousness. This is the method to become the destroyer of the five vices as well as the master of the five senses of sight, sound, smell, touch and

taste. The role of deity Shankar is only one divine aspect of God Shiva. God Shiva's is distinct and separate from that of deity Shankar, as He is separate and distinct from deity Brahma. Shankar is the memorial of Brahma's perfect stage of renunciation and intense meditation. Hence the reason Shankar is shown in meditative posture.

3. The third aspect is that of Vishnu, the Sustainer. When God Shiva re-establishes righteousness (*dharma*) of the Golden age through Brahma, Brahma then takes rebirth as the first prince of the Golden age known as Krishna. Krishna then gets married to the first princess of the Golden age named

Radhey and this ceremony (Swayamvar) leads to their coronation as the first Emperor and Empress of the Golden age. Their names then become Lakshmi and Narayan who then represent the family path of the deity civilisation. Their role is to rule and give sustenance to humanity.

The combined form of Lakshmi and Narayan is known as


Vishnu, the sustainer of the world. Vishnu is shown adorned with the Eternal World Drama Wheel (chakra) on the index finger of the upper right hand. The Mace (Gada) is held with the lower right hand that depicts both self-sovereignty (Swaraj) as well as world sovereignty with peace, prosperity and happiness. The Conch Shell represents the dissemination of Godly knowledge and the Lotus Flower represents complete purity in thoughts, words and actions.

The female aspect of Vishnu is Maha Lakshmi shown standing in a one-hundred petal white lotus flower giving material wealth as well as blessings.

In essence, therefore, Brahma, Vishnu and Shankar are subtle deities who assist God Shiva to transform the old ironaged world into the golden-aged world of heaven during the auspicious Confluence age (*Purushottam Sangamyuga*), the last 100 years of the Iron Age (*Kaliyuga*).

COPENHAGEN, DENMARK

(Climate Change Conference)

The UN summit on climate change started on 7th December, with delegates from 192 countries. Some scientists described it as the most important conference the world had ever seen.

On 6th December, there were 17 members of the delegation in all from diverse countries. The B.K. delegation

consisted of: Sister Jayanti, Head of delegation, Sisters Julia, UN office in New York; Sonja, National Coordinator of the Danish Centers; Patricia, former government Climate Change negotiator, Peru; Brothers: Renaud, Quality Security Environment Manager, France, and Arnold from the Netherlands.

The BKs' message read the following:

- ▶ Clean energy solutions from matter will be created from the clean energy source of our minds.
- ▶ Solutions to climate change in the world are being sorted with questions of how we can organise the production and use energy in a way that is both equitable and sustainable. To adopt the solutions needed and bring into reality any shared vision, we will need to use the energy of pure thoughts and simple lifestyles.
- ▶ We are specialists in creating a harmonious and peaceful atmosphere. We should pay special attention to our thoughts and feelings so that stressful debates and negotiations can be resolved.

It is important to realise that we are the ones who, with God's directions and power, are creating the new world and we are creating the *sanskars* needed for the new world now — in the Confluence Age — these sanskars of pure thoughts and simplicity are being created now at the Confluence Age.

Christiana Climate Bottom Meeting – Windows of Hope

This was a meeting that was parallel to the Climate summit, primarily taking place at Christiana – an alternative living area in Copenhagen, started in an abandoned army barracks in Copenhagen, in 1971 as self-proclaimed autonomous neighbourhood, the current government was not particularly sympathetic with the aims and achievements of Christiania, since soft drugs had been part of the experience.

Sister Jayanti was a speaker under the day's theme "Worldview, Culture and Spirituality".

Victor Andes from Brazil spoke of "The Relation between Ecology and the South American Spirit" on the importance of a positive vision and to take inspiration from the values of community living of some of the South American traditional ways of life; such as sharing, helping one another, renewal and love.

All the presentations opened up the perfect "window of insight" for those present. **B.K**. **Sister Jayanti** told everyone

that our true identity was of spirit and not matter. That with this recognition we would have the power to make the changes necessary; with the power of our minds, our pure thoughts, we could transform matter. She then led everyone in a powerful meditation.

Evening Programme at the Centre – "The Spirit of Service"

Here, Sister Jayanti spoke on how to provide help to others, managing our time without using up our own energy — taking power from God and being an instrument. Rasa, the Ambassador of Lithuania to Denmark and part of our 'Call of the Time' network, spoke afterwards of how helpful and practical she found the talk. About 50 people attended the programme.

PHILIPPINES (Dr. Nirmala's Visit)

On the evening of 26th November, the small proscenium theatre of RCBC Plaza was delicately lit. Some 350 guests had come for "Tolerance and Non-Violence", a programme mounted by the Brahma Kumaris in celebration of the United Nation's International Day for

Tolerance.

The selected crowd included new contacts from the UN White Helmets of the Philippines and UN Youth Association of the Philippines; Hubert d'Aboville, President and CEO of Paris Manila Technology Corporation (concurrently president of the European Chamber Commerce); First Secretary Ahimsa Soekartono of the Indonesian Embassy; and representative from the Embassy of The Netherlands. Familiar faces included former Miss Universe Margie Moran-Floirendo.

Sister Becky Ortega presented the Brahma Kumaris' work in the United Nations to bring peace awareness to various countries. She stressed on the urgency of cultivating tolerance and non-violence, especially in these times.

The two speakers for the evening were then introduced: Carmencita Abella, president of the Ramon Magsaysay Award Foundation, Asian equivalent of the Nobel Peace Prize; and Dr. Nirmala Kajaria, BK Regional Coordinator in Asia-Pacific.

Dr. Nirmala emphasised: "Intolerance creates violence."

Violence is the fruit of "subtle vices of the soul," she said, such as greed and ego. Speaking from her experience as a meditation practitioner for 40 years, Dr. Nirmala explained that meditation allows people to positively work on themselves and makes the impossible, possible.

'Experiencing Inner Power and Protection'

Some 65 guests came to the Centre for Spiritual Learning for the programme, "Experiencing Inner Power and Protection" on 29th November in Tagaytay. Among them were the faculty and staff of the Union Theological Seminary, Catholic nuns of the Good Shepherd Convent, seminarians of Joseph Marello House, and professionals from a bank and a local restaurant. Didi Nirmala stressed that power should not come from the outside, but from our inner sense as who we really are – as spiritual beings, children of the Supreme." She shared the experiences of some Rajyogis in various countries, who went through difficult situations but felt the protection of a divine power because of their accurate and constant link with God.

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
