## 'Journalists need to understand common man's suffering'

Mysuru, Aug.7-'A good journalist should understand the pain and suffering of a common man and must respond in time, as journalists are basically social workers. Thousands of eyes watch us always and therefore we should be careful in our work', said N.Raju, President of Karnataka State Working Journalists Association, Bengaluru.

He was delivering inaugural address of a media convention organized today by Brahmakumaris, Mysuru at their 'Gyan Sarovar' complex on Hunsur Road. The convention on topic 'Society and Mass Media' was attended by 160 media delegates from five districts.
