Commonwealth Boxing Championship 2010 Delhi

Col PK Muralidharan Raja, Secretary General, Iindian Boxing Federation (IBF) extended cordial invitation on behalf of Sh Abhay Singh Chautala, President of IBF, to the faculty members of Sports Wing of Brahma Kumaris, which was represented by BK. Shashi Prabha, National Coordinator, BK Jagbir Singh, HQs Coordinator of Sports Wing and BK Antonella Ferrari from Italy.

Indian Boxing Federation (IBF) organised 5th Commonwealth Boxing Championship 2010 commenced from 12th to 18th March, 2010 at Talkatora Stadium, New Delhi, India.

This event witnessed over 100 boxers from 14 countries in over 100 bouts. All major commonwealth boxing nations including India, Sri Lanka, Malaysia, Singapore (ASIA), England, Wales, Scotland (EUROPE), New Zealand, Samoa, Sierra Lione (OCEANIA) Kenya, Tanzania, Mauritius, Botswana, (AFRICA), and Bahamas (AMERICA) participated. The boxers were segregated in 10 following weight categories 49 kgs, 52 kgs, 56 kgs, 60 kgs, 64 kgs, 69 kgs, 75kgs, 81 kgs, 91 kgs, + 91 kgs.

It might be recalled that IBF has appointed leading sports marketing firm, Percept Ltd as its exclusive marketing partner for IBF for 4 years i.e. till 2014. As a marketing partner Percept Ltd will work alongside IBF to promote domestic and international boxing events to India and Indian Boxing talents.

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Since last couple of years boxing as a sport has taken a center stage in India, with boxers such as Vijender Singh, Akhil Kumar, Dinesh Kumar, Suranjoy Singh, Nanao Singh & Mary Kom winning accolades for the country. Boxing is the 5th most watched televised sport in the world and reflects youth, aggression and glamour which are the most important element of sport entertainment.

Medalists at this Championships are likely to be medal winners again at Commonwealth Games 2010 at the same venue ie. Talkatora Stadium, New Delhi in October 2010. Large number of boxers in the top 20 World rankings participated in this event.

Indian boxing heroes such as Vijender Singh, Akhil Kumar, Dinesh Kumar, Nanao Singh, Suranjay Singh etc were seen in action in front of the home crowd. Earlier India had won 5 medals (1Gold, 2 Silver and 2 Bronze) in 2006 Commonwealth Games at Melbourne.

Common Wealth Boxing Championship is being supported by Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports, Organizing Committee of Commonwealth Games and Sports Authority of India.

Col PK Muralidharan Raja, VM has lot of regard for the services done by the Sports Wing of Brahma Kumaris. He also invited the faculty members of Sports Wing in the 4th World Women Boxing Championship held at the same venue from 17th to 24th Nov 2006, our women boxers won overall championship. And this time also our country won the overall team title.

He wished to visit Mount Abu to participate in the next Sports Wing Seminar to be held from 8th to 12 May 2010 on 'Mental Energy through Meditation'.

Indian boxers swept six of the 10 gold medals on offer in the Commonwealth Boxing Championship. They made a clean sweep in the finals to win the overall team title. The Great Britain team achieved four gold medals, a silver and five bronze medals in the fifth Commonwealth Boxing Championship and stood runners up.


