

# **BK UK Family Gathering with Dadi Gulzar**

## **Saturday 16th July 2011, am**

### **GCH , LONDON**

Around 450 BK's from across the UK gathered in GCH auditorium for a special meeting with Dadi Gulzar. Sudesh Didi and Sister Jayanti welcomed the gathering and shared their inspirations.

**Sudesh Didi** reminded us that we had never even contemplated the thought of becoming deities, until Baba enabled our intellects to unlock and the third eye to open. This has allowed us to understand who we are and have great faith in ourselves.

**Sister Jayanti** noted how Baba made it firm for us last season that each one should create a time for doing service through the mind and how wonderful it is that we are all threaded together with the one thread of the murli. Now we have the opportunity to unify our thoughts with the recent mansa seva points being sent out with the murlis. She shared that Dadi Gulzar had clarified the importance of acting as instruments for world service when sending sakaash, and not to just send to individuals. These vibrations will then spread around the world and those with minds open definitely receive, and those that don't experience it now will do so later on. The preparation we need to make is deep yoga to transform the self, so the mind is clean and the heart pure, and to keep Baba as our Companion. The more we do our internal work, the more Baba will serve through us. Sister Jayanti finished by sharing that the hearts and minds of souls will start to change as the vibrations in the world start to change.

**Dadi Gulzar** was welcomed with a beautiful dance by **Sister Dipti** and the ceremony was led by **Sister Jaymini**, and included a slide show celebrating 75 years of the yagya.

In her class, *written up separately*) Dadi reminded us of the importance of time and thoughts, especially with regard to mansa seva, the amazing fortune of Baba choosing us, and the value of the Confluence Age.

Those souls in the gathering who have been in gyan for a year or less were invited up onto the stage to join the happy cake cutting ceremony. Bhog was offered and everyone present had the opportunity to take Dadi's drishti and receive toli and blessings from Sudesh Didi and Sister Jayanti.

The morning was completed with Brahma Bhojan.

REPORT

Around 850 BKs from the Greater London area gathered on Sunday 17<sup>th</sup> July to celebrate a special meeting with Dadi Gulzar. The auditorium stage was beautifully decorated with a 'garland' of greenery all along the front of the stage and grand displays of golden yellow hollyhocks and lilies – a theme that was extended into the Conference Hall, too, where many were watching on the big screen.

The morning began with meditation at 6.30, followed by combined murli, read by Sudesh Didi, in which Baba in the first of two short murlis reminded us that the final date depends on the revelation of everyone (the theme of Dadi Gulzar's class yesterday).

Sudesh Didi, Jayantiben and Maureen offered bhog to Baba. Dadi Gulzar then arrived on stage and the gathering sat in sweet, powerful remembrance, whilst Girishbhai sang the song about flying to the subtle regions to my Baba, Shiv Baba.

Girishbhai then welcomed Dadi Gulzar warmly, saying "Although we are far, we are very close... Our Dadi has come. You are, you were and you will always be ours."

A very special slide show created by Brother Faheed (Wajeeha's son) was then shown. It celebrated 40 years of avyakt sustenance from BapDada and Dadi Gulzarji and was a warm 'thank you' to Dadi for her sacrifice, her love and her surrender from 'all of us'. It really was a lovely scene, to see Dadi watching the images and videos from the side of the stage – of BapDada giving drishti, giving a blessing to double foreigners, being offered bhog by Dadi Janki on behalf of all the children and then, feeding Dadi (while indicating that He was feeding all the children too), lighting candles, throwing toli, in a very loving embrace with Dadi Janki and, finally, taking leave. The final image was of Dadi Gulzar with the Dadis and Seniors waving to the gathering in Shantivan, after BapDada's departure.

Ratanbhai spoke on behalf of the London family, thanking Dadi for coming and asking: 'Will Dadi come next year?' To which Dadi replied: 'Let's see what Baba says... it's up to the One above.'

Sister Milu read out a poem she had written for Dadi:

*In life we meet people all the time. And sometimes we like them. They become our friends for one time.  
But, Dadi, for someone like you, we remember you for a lifetime. So, Dadi, welcome to London all the time.*

Sister Milu then conducted an enlightening and inspiring interview with Dadi Gulzar, with Sister Jayanti and also contributing (which has been reported separately). After the interview, Sister Milu thanked Dadi, saying: Dadi, you are a powerful mirror for all of us and through you we can see Baba, ourselves and what we have to become. So, thank you, Dadi, for being you, as you are for all of us.

The morning was completed with yoga together, after which Dadi Gulzar visited the Conference Hall to meet the gathering there and then returned to give drishti to each one of Baba's children, while Sudesh Didi and Jayantiben gave toli, blessings and fruit in a powerful atmosphere of sweet silence.
