
THE FLAME GLOWS BRIGHTER EACH DAY...

These great souls proved to be worship-worthy jewels of the rosary of Supreme Father God Shiva. They were ever-inspired to follow the guidance of Brahma Baba, who maintained utmost confidence in these instruments.

As Mateshwari Saraswati left the scene in mid-60s, the mantle fell on Dadi Prakashmani to be torch-bearer of the Yagya after Brahma Baba ascended to the Subtle Region on becoming Sampoorn Avyakt Farishta (Perfect Subtle Angel). During Brahma lifetime. Baba's Dadi Prakashmani happened to be a



very trustworthy and reliable instrument of God. In her, Brahma Baba had seen the shining star who could lead the organization on his divine ascension. What a coincidence that Dadi Prakashmani found the prince of her dreams, when she had a vision of Shri Krishna, on the first day of attending the Om Mandali gathering (former name of Prajapita Brahma Kumaris Ishwariya Vishwa Vidyalaya). She also organized special yearly programmes for them to explore the depth of spirituality and beauty of divine virtues, through intense Meditation Retreats (Bhattis) at the Headquarters.

It was her deep faith that the world would become better only through the power of spiritual wisdom, human understanding and friendship, purity and truth. On several occasions, especially in the midst of holy Gurus, Saints and Priests, she used to share her faith in and commitment to living by impeccable purity by saying, "I have never spoken a single untruth all my life". As spiritual leader par excellence, she wielded her unique power of judgment while also being the embodiment of love, patience, and compassion. She touched the lives of millions during her lifetime, especially from 1937 to 2007. She could befriend juniors and seniors, the youth and children, within seconds through her pure child-like smile and innocent gestures. Her evershining qualities of love and friendship not only inspired innumerable souls then, but continue to guide us even now through her subtle presence in our lives.

Let's learn to emulate and live such a meaningful life of self-sacrifice, and dedication of serving humanity and purifying the global atmosphere. This would be the best way to observe 25th August 2011, the 4th anniversary of Dadi Prakashmaniji.

THE INNER VOICE –

A Brief Report on Retreat for Spiritual and Religious Leaders

(Global Retreat Centre, UK – 27th - 31st July, 2011)

A group of 35 people from 18 countries from Buddhist, Christian, Hindu, Jewish and Muslim faiths gathered for The Inner Voice, a retreat to explore the impact of inner stillness in our lives and in the world. Several were top leaders in their field who set aside this time to deepen and replenish their inner spiritual life.

The retreat took participants into an ever deepening journey of listening to the inner self, listening to the Divine and listening to the voice of humanity. It is impossible to capture in words the impact that this retreat had on the hearts and minds of all those present. A prominent Swami from India spoke of his realization that God is not in the idols but in the universe and in the face of love, compassion, truth and justice. As a great social activist, he spoke of the need for a spiritual model of development. "Spirituality is a movement; if not, then it degenerates into a monument!"

A professor of comparative religion from the UK spoke of the expansiveness of the presence of God and the deep strength needed to trust in life - life is a process greater than all of us. The head of an interfaith organization in Israel spoke of how we are banging our head against a wall trying to find God and yet we do not know how to use the door to go inside. If I see a relationship that is not based on love then it is my duty to make it better.

A prominent church leader from South Africa spoke of how God is not finished with us. God is continuing to reveal Himself. He questioned, 'how do I intervene without revenge?' There is a God who belongs to all of us and to whom we all belong. One Buddhist leader from South Korea (now living in the US) spoke of nourishing our divine nature and the transformative power of silence. "The clouds come and go but the sky never changes."

A Rabbi, who has worked all his life for peace, spoke, "How when we can include everyone with an inner source of dignity, then together we shall constitute the image of God. "It is often difficult to live with God but even more difficult to live without God."

Dadi Janki's presence brought the deep experience of silence and wisdom to the gathering. She shared that to listen to my inner voice; the heart that has been hurt has to heal. She spoke of the importance of patience, tolerance and contentment. The ability to tolerate brings a sense of belonging. God is truth, God is love. The purpose of all of us coming together is to know what truth is and to serve others. "Make power into truth and truth into power." Dadi spoke of the eight powers and the importance of being accurate,

alert and always present on service.

There were stories of inspiration from a Catholic Father from Brazil who has turned around the lives of thousands of street children in Sao Paulo, of an analyst who works at the International Criminal Court at The Hague on the evidence for war crimes and of a women who worked for many years at the Anne Frank House of Amsterdam when it was first opened to the public. As well as an evening concert at the Retreat Centre, the group was also hosted by Christchurch Cathedral and College, Oxford University.

At the closing session, many shared the spiritual gifts they had taken. A Muslim who is the head of the inter-religious organisation in Malaysia asked us to have a minute of silence to give thanks to Brahma Baba, who made all of this possible.

hroughout the whole cycle, we will never find anyone like Baba, Almighty Authority God Shiva. Were you looking for Baba or did Baba find you? Many would say: Baba found me. I was lost in my own self. Having found Baba, we forget everything else. We don't like the old, impure world anymore.

Brahma Baba had the picture of Shri Krishna made in Mumbai with a lot of love, wherein the Lord is holding a globe of heaven and the Murli in his hands and kicking away hell. Shri Krishna says: 'I am coming'... But who played the Murli? We understand that it is Shiv Baba who spoke the Murli (elevated versions) through the medium of Brahma. When we speak of Shiv Baba, we speak of Him as the One up above. He comes and awakens us through the Murli. Sit in remembrance, listen to the Murli, and then perform actions as a karma yogi. It should be visible that you are a yogi soul performing actions.

Baba never used to allow us

to sit in the Bhandara (Dining Room) at the time of Murli. Once, I sat down to prepare Bhog at the time of Murli. Baba got me up and said: Child, at the time of Murli Class, you have to listen to the Murli because there is magic in this Murli. The Murli is able to transform everything completely. Through the Murli you connect your mind with God and develop the habit of focusing on God. If your mind is filled with other things, you will not enjoy the Murli. The Murli is a mirror in which you see yourself.

Everything has to be accurate. When you are preparing food, if there is little or more salt in it, people would not enjoy eating. Everyone has a role in the establishment of the new world. The world is being created with each one's finger of co-operation. It is not that you can do without this one person or that one. God wants every type of soul in creation of the new world. Actors in a limited play understand what their particular role is. Each one plays his part accordingly. Even two identical twins cannot play their part in the same way, even if they are given the same role. We cannot say: "This is not good, this one is not good." Know that the Drama is predestined. Previously, since we did not have knowledge of the World Drama we were discontented and unhappy. With Baba's knowledge, we receive peace and love. But with knowledge of the Drama we are able to remain stable. Those who have knowledge of the Drama accurately in their intellect will never fluctuate.

Knowledge of the soul gives peace. Knowledge of God gives power, and knowledge of the drama makes us cheerful. No matter how much you say "Baba, Baba", but if you don't like a particular scene in the drama you cannot remain cheerful. If you want to remain cheerful, then remember the drama.

Baba said: You have to be entertaining. How can I become that? My face should never be confused or wilted. With understanding, I am able to remain mature so that I do not fluctuate in small situations. Being cheerful does not mean laughing out loudly all the time.

Mama had such a powerful stage that no one noticed her physical body, even though she


was in a serious condition at the end. This is only possible with knowledge of the Drama. I need to have deep practice of being bodiless over a long period of time, so that whatever scene comes in front of me my face remains the same and is not influenced. Baba said: It is nothing new. It had to happen and so it happened. It was the Drama. That is all. The knowledge of the Drama makes us unshakeable and immovable, and also teaches us to play with jewels of knowledge.

Knowledge is first sweet and then we realise its value. The value of education and income is realised when a child grows old. Unless I earn my own income I cannot understand the value of it. Baba gives us sovereignty and then makes us worthy to rule the kingdom of the pure world. We have donated and performed charity at this time and so receive the return of that for the whole cycle. In the Iron age, people attain everything through fighting, but we do not have the sanskars of fighting or battling. We are simply happy with our own fortune. We do not snatch anything from anyone, but create our fortune for the future 84 births with understanding. My face should reveal the sovereignty I have had throughout the whole cycle.

For example, if someone does not extend cooperation to another person at the time of necessity, there may be different reasons for such a situation. The person concerned may be busy otherwise or involved in a situation wherein he is helpless.

LIFE IS A CORPORATE ENDEAVOUR - CO-OPERATION ITS BINDING FORCE

It is well known that life is independent as well as interdependent. As swami Vivekananda said 'we have very few living people in the world'. He also said 'Who are those living people? Living people are those people who live for others. Others are more dead than alive'. Living for others means to extend cooperation in times of necessity. Even in other situations also, wherever possible, we must cooperate for the decent, happy, peaceful and tidy upkeep of this world. We must give more than what we take from this world. Our life is a corporate endeavour. We are living with the

cooperation of those who are in our surroundings and also those who are far away and unknown to us. For example, we eat our food which is prepared by others. If we go to the background, we can find that the farmers who are toiling in their farms made it possible for us to be sitting on the dining table and enjoying the food. The cloth we wear is made by others, the place we live in is made by others, the vehicle we travel is made by others and so on and so forth. Therefore, if anyone is blocking the track of cooperation they are in fact saboteurs of the amiable and amicable conditions of this world. It is the duty and responsibility of each and every one of us to extend cooperation when it is required for a particular situation or for a particular cause. There are some people who do not extend cooperation, in spite of knowing that a particular person is in dire need of cooperation. It is a willful neglect of one's duties and responsibilities. We can learn many aspects of cooperation from the nature. A tree is giving shade to a passerby. A river is flowing down the stream watering the land on the way or quenching the thirst of a weary traveller.

BLOCKS IN THE TRACK OF COOPERATION

We must be aware of those saboteurs of cooperation, who are the enemies of humankind who block the track of cooperation. The following are some of the situations where the track of co-operation is blocked.

▶ 1. Because of jealousy, some people block the track of cooperation and dislike the person who needs cooperation fearing that if they extend cooperation, he may overtake them and snatch away the opportunities due to them.

► 2. Some people do not extend cooperation due to the fear that they will lose their importance, name and fame thinking that if such a person becomes popular, their own popularity would fade away.

▶ 3. Some people think that it is their right to demand cooperation from others while they do not want to cooperate with others.

◆ 4. Some people do not cooperate in the name of religion, caste, language, region, status and so on.

► 5. Some people not wanting anyone else to become better and richer than themselves don't cooperate with them who are more capable, more efficient and much better than themselves to come up in life.

▶ 6. Some people avenge others by not cooperating with them and adding further problems to them in already existing crisis situation and enjoy on their sufferings.

▶ 7. Some people drowned in the vices of sex-lust, anger, greed, attachment, ego, jealousy and sloth are not able to cooperate for the welfare of this world because of the negative and vicious mindset. Their nature is to create noncooperation and problems for others.

KEYS TO REMOVE THE BLOCKS

We must remove the above blocks from the minds of these people with the power of pure feelings and good wishes and unconditional of acts cooperation to them in different ways which should positively force them to fall in line with. God's remembrance with good intentions and thoughts of others' wellbeing will be another positive course of action to enlist the cooperation of such people.

COOPERATION IS AN ETERNAL VALUE

The Gita exhorts 'parasparam bhavayantah srevasparam avapsyatha' which means to attain prosperity and welfare by following the way of mutuality and cooperation. Where there is love, cooperation is a natural upsurge. It need not be asked Cooperation is an for. expression of gratitude in life. Life is a long journey. Mutual help and cooperation make the journey easier, happier and pleasant. Where there is cooperation, there is happiness. Cooperation is a combination of loveful, faithful and goodwill filled feelings for others. Cooperation is also a kind of great charity. Charity should be given to those who deserve it as otherwise such people will misuse our cooperation. 'Cooperation' is a divine virtue. 'Cooperation' is also the nucleus of Godly service. There are four subjects of Godly knowledge being taught by Incorporeal God Shiva through the medium of Prajapita Brahma - Gyan-Knowledge, Yogameditation. Dharanainculcation of divine virtues and Seva-Godly service. All these four subjects are independent and also inter-dependent. If one has to understand Godly knowledge properly, he should practise meditation and through meditation one inculcates divine virtues. The consequence of these efforts will make one a godly servant meaning thereby

that one is on the run to extend unconditional cooperation through thoughts, words and actions to one and all irrespective of religion, region, caste, creed, language etc. Therefore, the natural nature of those who are in the path of godly knowledge and yoga is to extend cooperation to one and all. When someone is found slow in effort-making or finding difficulty in effort making, it is our duty to extend cooperation. There is no word as 'non-cooperation' in the dictionary of Godly servants. Our mutual cooperation at the personal level will ensure cooperative initiatives at the macro level for the Godly task of world transformation. We must be aware of the reality of existence. We are the children

SHE SMILED, SHE LOVED, SHE CONQUERED


(The life that redefined leadership)

on't you ever have a headache, Dadiji¹? You shoulder the responsibility of such a large worldwide organization!" it was a question emerging spontaneously from a participant at a National Conference of Engineers and Scientists. Dadi Prakashmani, the then Chief Administrative Head of the Brahma Kumaris World Spiritual Organization, was meeting all the delegates. Dadiji's eyes twinkled as she responded, "No, I don't have headaches because I don't consider myself as the head ... " She explained, "I am an instrument and am led by the Supreme Being, the Almighty God. What simpler and greater lesson can one have on managing stress? And it works, surely, as it did for 80-year old Dadiji who was co-ordinating 8.000 centres in more than 120 countries then.

There was a precious moment I was fortunate to witness and experience every year (until Dadi was amongst us) when I visited Shantivan, the International Headquarters of Prajapita Brahma Kumaris Ishwariya Vishwa Vidyalaya, Mt. Abu, Rajasthan. Every morning, Dadiji enters Diamond Hall, encompassing about eighteen thousand spiritual students, and waves of enthusiasm make the entire hall come alive. During her sweet loving initial conversation, when Dadiji asked innocently, "Is everyone okay? Is each one satisfied with the accommodation arrangements? Does anyone need something? Please inform Dadi about it," every soul in that assembly of thousands used to be touched deep within and felt "Dadiji cares for me."

Whether it was a meet of the most venerable amongst religious heads or a conference of highly accomplished jurists or administrators, Dadiji first entered through their heart, strengthened their self-respect, and then shook their conscience, "How many of you, my brothers and sisters, are willing to give up your undesirable habits, to give up vices?" I've seen the brilliance of truth as words



poured out of her lips, "Dadi has never lied in her entire life." It was not a pride, it was not a challenge; it was just a beautiful mirror reflecting evidence that integrity is indispensable for long-lasting success.

Dadi Prakashmani, who headed the Brahma Kumaris organisation from 1969 to 2007, dazzled everyone everyday as she allowed an entirely unique form of leadership emerge from within herself. Her expression of love and values was beyond everyone's imaginable limits thereby constantly setting new standards for spiritual effort and spiritual service. It is no wonder then that this organization is unique in the world in many respects. It is led by women, is completely volunteer-driven, there are no fees or charges for any of its services, it does not actively seek donations from the general public, focuses on spiritual education than on material charity, encourages analytical thought on orthodox religious and social practices, emphasizes personal example as the precursor for social change and provides forums for daily life-long spiritual learning, taking no holidays!

World history has been a witness to various kinds of leaders who influenced the course of their communities towards development or degradation. For a large majority, the principled leaders like Mahatma Gandhi or Abraham Lincoln are "ideal leaders' but the same majority does not see in themselves the strength to emulate their ideal. There is a crucial need for leaders who inspire by personal example in the current scenario, who have immense love that can bind everyone in unity, who have deep respect for all which knocks down ego, who can love both the perpetrators and the victims of oppression and heal both - leaders who have no desire to be leaders - but the pure intention to simply serve.

Dadi Prakashmani was such a leader. She had unflinching faith in the vision -of recreating the original social order of perfect harmony on earthshared by God. She was quoted in 'Life Positive' magazine stating, "(Establishment of) Satyuga² is as sure as death."

Love was what led this mighty leader. From the time she joined Brahma Baba, the founding father of the organisation, she had a pure desire for self-progress and for service. Only 14-year old then in 1937, she was made responsible for a school that was started to provide holistic education to small children, an education that balanced their spiritual, intellectual, emotional and physical development. Despite her young age, Baba would entrust her tasks like writing letters to organisations such as Cambridge University, and to important public figures like Mahatma Gandhi, discussing important aspects of spiritual thought. Throughout her life, Dadi Prakashmani had to take high jumps stretching far beyond what she imagined her potential to be. But her love for God gave her the courage and faith that it was possible. And her deep love for each soul in the world family enthused her furthermore.

Respect and freedom were the natural outcomes of her love for all. One of Dadiji's favourite slogans was, "Stay in elevated self-respect and give respect to all." As Caroline Ward³ shares in the video 'Jewel of Light', "Dadiji had a schedule which might cripple someone of her age. Yet, if you come in front of her, it's as if you are the only person in the world... she is 100% present." Dadiji understood people from their own frame of reference. So, the solutions she found were simple and effective, based on the capacities and unique needs of the particular situation. One might ponder "who has the time today for such listening? When will tasks get done then?" But Dadiji's army of lakhs of volunteers could vouch for the effectiveness of this approach. Each person whom Dadiji met (whether personally or in groups), went back with a deep sense of fulfilment and deep trust in her leadership that translated into long-term commitment, higher selfconfidence and increased capacities to manage themselves and their service better. The freedom that she gave nurtured immense innovation in the organization. The Brahma Kumaris organisation has one of the most outstanding decentralized structures in the world, bound by Godly Love. Many

pioneering efforts saw daylight only because of this environment of openness, freedom and trust.

'Keep everyone content as much as possible' was Dadiji's daily song. Is it a safe goal to pursue, many might wonder today? Steven Covey writes in the famous book '7 Habits of Highly Effective People'-"for win-win interactions, you got to be nice and be courageous, empathic and also confident". Dadiji was a living example of this principle. As God's instrument, she wanted everyone to adhere to divine principles. But as a mother, she ensured that her family never felt bound by these principles but rather learnt to love God and love and understand those principles; she brought about a winning balance between love and law.

Dadiji's mirror-clean character inspired enormous trust. How else would it be possible to draw the support of millions of volunteers who give best quality service to their divine family? Most people who visit the organisation's campuses, have a common observation, "there is nobody overtly commanding anyone here, work just flows." This is the organisational culture Dadi has groomed. Financial resources also flowed in due to this foundation of integrity.

It was pure spiritual strength that enabled Dadiji to be brimming with enthusiasm every moment. After doing intensive service along with volunteers, when everyone would be tired, she would still be fresh enough to serve the volunteers too. She woke up at 2 a.m. everyday to meditate and give vibrations of peace, love and good wishes to the entire world.

Humility was Dadiji's radiant crown that kept her easy and light forever. She always acknowledged the contribution of her colleagues, giving full respect to their views and opinions. She frequently engaged everyone in play, art, celebrations and picnics. She shattered the typical notion that spirituality was all serious business devoid of fun.

Dadiji was a great student of spiritual knowledge. She also chose to learn from challenges, from people, from criticism and she valued the learning. She was honest, had no hidden agendas and no insecurities. Hence, her mind was free to help others.

As her name signifies 'Jewel of Light', Dadi Prakashmani, for me, was a clear mirror in which I discovered my own beauty and realised that a new age of harmony is possible. She believed 100% in the inside-out approach, invested in people and relationships, managed perfect balance between process and outcomes and created a nourishing environment for God's garden to grow and bloom. She was a Servant Leader, a Parent Leader but never seeking leadership... simply serving. Perhaps this is why Dadiji was popular yet incognito. For beloved God and His magical instrument, i.e., Dadiji, my heart resounds with the words of a famous song.

"I can fly high like an eagle because you are the wind beneath my wings." •

These acquired sanskars are the bane of the present world, and the root cause of poverty, corruption, destruction of human values, wars and the accompanying misery and unhappiness, religious bigotry and hatred among peoples and nations, leading to evils like terrorism and killing of innocent people. five vices The have overpowered individuals all over the world, so much so that mental and intellectual faculties have almost abdicated any responsibility of one's actions.

Humans have become

helpless. We are caught in a sort of vicious circle: our negative sanskars give rise to negative actions, which further strengthen the former. Our mind is like a horse, evergalloping at a high speed, without any sense of direction, under the influence of our negative sanskars. This horse is not only wayward and headstrong but also unbridled. Unless we hold the bridle, 'intellect', firmly in our hands to rein in the horse and turn it towards the path of goodness, we will certainly come crashing down one day and hurt ourselves deeply.

The mind and intellect are great powers gifted by God to human beings. Concentrating on matter and material things, humans have worked wonders with these powers but yet little is known about them. Just think about what can be achieved if one truly focuses attention on them! However, this is difficult as the mind and intellect have become prisoners of the negative *sanskars*. What should have been the master has now become a mere slave.

In one of his recent articles published in the Hindustan Times, Sri Sri Ravi Shankar, a noted spiritual leader, expresses his view that we should educate people to shun terrorism. I have all respect for him but wonder who the 'we' are whom he refers to? Who will travel to the different places and deliver a discourse on non-violence and brotherly love to a gathering of Talibans and Al Qaeda followers? How will it be achieved?

Things have come to such a pass i.e. divisions in today's society have become so deeprooted that the world is well past the stage of simply lecturing people to do good or set things right. The task of changing the mindset of people in this age is beyond the capacity of any human being, however great and saintly he or she might be. No religious teacher or scripture can achieve it. Founders of various religions and belief systems have not been able to unite humanity together. So it is necessary for us to think of different tactics and ideologies.

PURITY, PEACE and LOVE are the true and original nature of the human soul. But there is no fragile peace and love in the world today because man has not only lost his original

sanskars but has also forgotten that he is a spirit, a being of divine energy or soul. Therefore, he identifies himself with the body, bodily relations, comforts, possessions, and everything connected with the body. The intellect and mind have become tainted with thoughts of body consciousness, leading to selfish and unrighteous actions. From soulconsciousness, humans have adopted body-consciousness resulting in the play of negative sanskars and karma, and the pitiable condition of the world!

All around us is turmoil, stress, tension, worry, anxiety, sense of insecurity, and above all, a fear of untimely and sudden death of self or near and dear ones. Diseases. like heart trouble. blood pressure, diabetes etc. caused by tension, irresponsible eating habits and erratic lifestyle, are the order of the day. Rich people, who are almost a majority among the victims of these diseases, pay thousands of rupees to attend lectures of high-profile teachers who profess to teach you the art of stress-free and happy living. If nothing else, these courses provide individuals a break from their hectic life, to enjoy a sort of vacation and chance to meet others of their like.

PEACE AND HAPPI-

NESS are the two most soughtafter experiences in the world. Humans have been in search for a long time, but there has never been a greater need for them as now. Many wars have been fought. Individuals have travelled from country to country, continent to continent to seek new habitations and colonies for livelihood. Machines have been invented to make work lighter and simpler; humans have devised quicker means of communication and transportation to realise the dream of globalization, so much so that he is now exploring space to make his or her home in Mars. All has been done in the name of peace and happiness which have sadly eluded us so far.

Do not be disheartened. Humans has now turned to religion and spirituality with the avowed purpose of achieving not only a stress-free and violence-free society, but also for attaining eternal peace. Numerous television channels have sprung up, spewing religious lectures and discourses day and night. So many gurus, religious teachers and spiritual preachers have lately emerged to provide a host of yogic exercises, meditation techniques, art of living courses etc. Lakhs of Hindus go to

Haridwar, Varanasi and other religious places every year. They bathe in the Ganges thinking that a dip in the Ganges will wash away their sins. They throw gold coins and ornaments into the river as a mark of penance for their sins. Some stand on one leg for hours together in the hope that God will take mercy, absolve them of all their sins and deliver them from the cycle of birth and death.

BUT can we say with confidence that the world has become a better and safer place to live in? Efforts to find peace and happiness have come to naught. We have delved deeper into the mind and sharpened the intellect in pursuit of these goals, but sadly enough, we have missed the root cause of our troubles: our present negative *sanskars*. Unless purified, these *sanskars* will keep us away from peace and happiness.

OUR FIGHT IS thus with our present *sanskars*, which we have acquired over the course of hundreds of years, birth after birth. Doctors usually advise that many physical illnesses are caused by toxins which get deposited inside the body. Our negative *sanskars* are also like toxins which debilitate our mental faculties. So we need to get rid of or transform the negative *Sanskars* if we wish to experience peace of mind.

I often pass through a park in the morning, on my way to the Brahma Kumaris centre, where I see a group of elderly men doing physical exercise. After they finish their exercise, one of them chants a prayer loudly and others repeat after him. The prayer goes:

Parampita Paramatma Hum hain tumhari Atma Papon ka kar do khatma

(O' the Supreme Father, the Supreme Soul

We are your souls,

Put an end to our negative actions)

I respect the sentiments expressed in this prayer as they sound very noble. However, when people say 'we are God's souls', they generally believe that we souls are a part of Him. The correct meaning, however, is that we souls are His children. The third line of the prayer can be changed a little as it leads us nowhere. While it is we who commit vices, how can we expect God to put an end to them? It would be more effective to ask God to help us realise the truth and eliminate the vices.

WHAT is the way out of the mess that the humans have

made for themselves? There is no problem in the world which has no solution. We only have to first know and realize what the problem is. There are many of us who, like the proverbial pigeon in the story, have closed their eyes to the dangers ahead, thinking that there is no danger at all. We sometimes argue why we should bother about the world's problems when we have plenty of our own. But whether it's our problems or that of the world, they are as clear as daylight. They are fast leading us to towards chaos and end of the world as we know it. Hatred and enmity among people for reasons of nationality, religion, caste, colour, material gains, ongoing arms race have crossed all limits of safety. The world is practically sitting on a volcano crater which may become active and erupt any time.

THERE ARE PEOPLE who realise there are severe problems with the world but they do not know how to deal with them. They want change but their approach to bring about the change is inaccurate: most people think that whatever they do, good or bad, is the will of God, and therefore the change is also His responsibility.

But let us not worry. God has

a plan for such souls which is already in action. To know this plan, we first need to understand certain truths. Though some of these truths have already been stated in the preceding paragraphs, it is necessary to reiterate them so that the reader comprehends God's plan fully.

One: We are souls, and not mere bodies. Yes, bodies do exist but the body is only a means to an end - to enable the soul to perform its part in the world drama.

Two: Souls are distinct from the Supreme Soul, *Param-Atma or Paramatma*. God does not take birth in the manner that we do, and secondly God is ever the same whereas we souls pass through different stages of well-being.

Three: The relationship between the Supreme Soul and souls is that of Father and child. As such, souls are entitled to His spiritual inheritance.

Four: God is as much an entity as a soul is. He is not present everywhere and in every being. He is what He is and as He is, and we have to know and recognize Him as such.

Five: God is not only the Producer and the Director of the world drama, but also a Principal actor who has a role to play. Six: World history is the story of the rise and fall of Bharat from the pinnacle of Bharat's glory in *Satyug* to the depth of its ignominy in *Kalyug*.

Seven: Change is an eternal law of universe. *Satyug* will follow *Kalyug* as day follows night, and spring follows the winter.

Last: but not the least. There is a small auspicious period of time at the concluding stage of the world drama, which marks the end of *Kalyuga* and the dawn of a new Golden Age. This is when God descends on earth to establish a new world. He takes loan of a human body to make contact with us. This is His divine birth, an occasion celebrated only in India as *Shiv-Ratri or Shiv-Jayanti*. That time is now.

Armed with these weapons of knowledge, or rather decorated with these gems of knowledge, we shall not only understand this plan but also appreciate it. As this plan is for the benefit of all humanity (including the flora and the fauna), God does encourage and expect us to lend Him a hand in the execution of His plan, being His children and the rightful inheritors of His legacy. God has the power to do everything on His own but since it is a plan for our peace,

happiness and prosperity, should we not be motivated to participate in all that He is doing? Further, the roles to be played by each of us in the new era would be decided by the amount of help each one gives, under His guidance and direction.

We have given God many names while singing His praise and glory, one of them being 'Heavenly God Father'. The true significance of this phrase is that God is the One, and the only One, who creates heaven on earth. The hellish world we live in is set to be transformed into heaven; this is God's plan. The good news is that God is already playing His role within this plan.

IT WOULD REQUIRE many more such articles to describe God's plan in details. The strategy of the plan though is very simple. First of all, on meeting human souls, God gives us knowledge of Himself as the Supreme Soul, Supreme Father, and of us as souls, His children. Then, He takes us right into the secret of the World Drama, how it begins, what changes take place in the middle and how it is going to end. He reminds us of how we had been committing sins under the influence of the vices all this while, and importantly how this is the time for us to return to our eternal Supreme Home. Before returning home, it is essential to cleanse ourselves of past negative *karma* and *sanskars* so we can only return in our purest original state.

This cleansing happens by returning to our original state of soul-consciousness, which is achieved by staying in His company/remembrance, day and night. He is also the Supreme Teacher who educates His children to become worthy of receiving His gift of Heaven by imbibing the godly qualities of knowledge, love, compassion, purity and truth.

God's plan aims at fulfilling human beings' dream of a new world of plenty, peace and happiness, where there will not be any division on account of religion, nationality, language, color or economic interests; where there will be health and wealth all around; where human beings shall live in their pristine stage of soul-consciousness and where nature will regain its natural benevolence. It will be a new world order where mind. intellect and the body will work in harmony with each other, and our original sanskars will be very much in place.

he philosophy of Prajapita Brahma Baba. whom Incorporeal Shiv Baba had chosen to be His human medium to deliver His message to humanity, revolves around the concept of soul consciousness and the concept of absolute purity at the level of thought speech and deed. Baba preaches that all of us (being children of one God) are spiritual brethren and that between spiritual brothers, there exists no room for animosity, ill will or any negative thought or feeling. Baba also preaches that for attainment of absolute purity, soul has to undertake the journey of remembrance (Yaad ki Yatra) into both past and future. When soul goes down memory lane into past, it recaptures its primitive glory of the golden age--the glory, gradually lost by it on journey from golden age down to silver age, copper age and finally Iron Age. When soul undertakes journey into future, it looks forward to the re-establishment of the golden age and the

pristine glory, then to be regained by it through the noble deeds of the on-going Confluence Age (Sangam Yug.) The rewinding into past and the future winding into future reconnects the soul with its inherent characteristics of peace, love, happiness, knowledge, purity, kindness and power which the soul sets out to regain through Purusharth (noble karmas). When human attention gets stabilized in the twin awareness of soul's primitive glory of the past and the pristine glory to be regained in future, one experiences the bliss of getting reconnected to soul's inherent qualities of peace, love, happiness, knowledge, power, kindness and purity.

Brahma Baba's spiritual philosophy revolves around the axis of soul's journey on the wheel of its evolution and because this is the story of every single soul's evolution, it is the universal spiritual platform for each and every soul of the world to share in common, without reference to caste, colour, creed, nationality or religion. On this platform, there is no room for feelings of 'this' or 'that'.

Here it shall be in fitness of things to study the viewpoint of major religions of the world. Every Christian of the world knows about 'Paradise Lost' and 'Paradise Regained'. Paradise lost is the story of man's fall from soul-awareness to body-awareness and Paradise Regained is the story of Jesus Christ paying with his life for the sins of man and for the restoration of lost paradise to mankind.

The Holy Bible says that Man's first ancestors, Adam and Eve used to live pure and soul-conscious life in the Paradise called Garden of Eden. God had forbidden them to taste the fruit from apple tree because it had in it knowledge of body-awareness. But Satan, in order to avenge his fall from heaven to hell, at the hands of God, decided to destroy man's paradise by tempting Eve to taste the fruit of tree of knowledge. He became successful in his Satanic and evil design and man lost his paradise due to bodyconsciousness.

John Milton, the eminent British poet starts his epic -'Paradise Lost' with the following words: - Of Man's first Disobedience, and the fruit Of that Forbidden Tree, Whose mortal taste Brought death into the world And all our woe With loss of Eden, till one greater Man Restore us, and regain the blissful Seat, Sing Heavenly Muse

"EARTH FELT THE WOUND", says John Milton to describe the cursed moment of Eve's first bite of the fruit of knowledge. In Book IX of his world renowned epic, Milton gives a painful portrayal of Man's fall from soulconsciousness to body consciousness in the following words: -

She plucked, She ate Earth felt the wound And Nature from her Seat, Sighing through all her works Gave signs of woe THAT ALL WAS LOST

It is in the same spirit that William Wordsworth refers to child as Man's spiritual father. He says: -

Child is father of Man And I wish my days to be Bound each to each By natural piety

Wordsworth's wish to stay connected to the first day of his life through natural human piety is nothing but soul's longing for travelling to its primitive glory of the Golden Age. It is in this spirit that the writer has named his poem as An Ode to the Intimations of Immorality.

Wordsworth says: -"From God we come, Who is our home". But he painfully regrets that due to gradual loss of basic innocence of human soul, "There hath past away, A glory from the Earth".

Our Mohammedan brethren especially observe Ramzan as the month of purification of soul through fasts and penance. Again the idea is to enable the soul to stay connected to its inherent qualities of purity, peace, love, happiness, knowledge, power and kindness.

Sri Guru Nanak Dev, the first Guru of Sikhs, deeply laments and mourns over the state of abject condition of spiritual poverty to which man has degraded and subjected himself by keeping himself constantly engrossed in the items of bodyconsciousness and in the temporal values of the materialistic world. This pathetic condition of body-awareness to which man has fallen from his elevated state of soulconsciousness has been described by Sri Guru Nanak Dev Ji in Raag Siri Rag on page

15 of Aadi Sri Guru Granth Sahib in the following manner:-*Ras Suena, Ras Rupa, Kaman*

Ras Parmal ki Vaas Ras Ghore, Ras Seja, Mandar, Ras Meetha, Ras Maas Ete Ras Sarir Ke Kai Ghat Naam Niwas

The Bani (Holy Scripture) written originally in Gurmukhi script, can be translated into English in the following manner:-

Man has become so deeply engrossed in tastes of lust for gold, silver, body enjoyment, sweet fragrance of flowers, vegetation and fragrant wood, pomp and show, physical comforts, palatial houses, sweets and meat, that there is no room left for remembrance of God to help one undertake journey of soul's renewed connection with the Almighty.

In the same way, Gautam Budha and Swami Mahavir have preached the principle of 'Know thyself' as the pillar of man's spiritual strength. Knowing oneself is to know our spiritual roots and to learn to stay connected to them.

adi Prakashmani was a jewel of Light or Knowledge. She was given the spiritual name "Prakashmani" but was also known as Kumarka Dadi. After she started following the divine path, Brahma Baba became spiritual father and guide for her. She used to shoulder great responsibilities right from her childhood. She became a great spiritual teacher as she imbibed the tremendous knowledge spoken by Incorporeal God Shiva through the corporeal medium of Brahma Baba. Gradually, the fragrance of her virtues started spreading and her power of meditation brought zeal in thousands of disheartened souls.

Born in 1922 in Hyderabad, Sindh (Pakistan), Dadi ji was a great supporter for women, the poor and the weaker sections of society. She was an embodiment of simplicity and royalty. In this selfish world, she had the natural quality of attracting everyone with her kind words and humility. Anyone who visited Madhuban, i.e., International Headquarters of the Brahma Kumaris organization, could meet her and ask any question. She would ask the wellbeing of the participants and ensure that they were having a comfortable stay there. As she had such care and concern for all, one would really try to take spiritual guidance from such a humble and noble soul. Her generous nature was evident from the fact that she would certainly take out time to have interaction with the delegates of the ongoing conferences and seminars. Due to these sterling qualities, she had become quite popular among spiritual people and the participants of the conferences, particularly media persons. She would stroll in the courtyard of Madhuban in the morning and the evening. Anyone could meet her without seeking prior appointment.

After Brahma Baba left his mortal coil in 1969, she was appointed Chief Administrative Head of the Brahma Kumaris. She discharged this responsibility to the best of her

abilities and never compromised on principles of the organization. She was strict in maintaining discipline and she advised all to follow shrimat and adhere to the principle of purity. While interacting with B.K. brothers and sisters, she would always remain positive and courteous even in adverse situations. She would ask them not to worry and extended her full cooperation in overcoming their weaknesses. Her generous nature would certainly go a long way in removing the hurdles in the field of service. Her most important and unforgettable advice was to give love to all and be humble.

I had the opportunity to meet Dadiji when she was appointed Chief Administrative Head of the BKs in 1969, after Brahma Baba became avyakt. After that also I met her on many occasions and found her always to be positive and supportive. I also noticed one more thing that she never spoke such words that would hurt anyone or offend them. Master of a positive personality, she would always inspire others, uplifting and encouraging them. It was because of her sterling qualities of head and heart that the organisation reached new heights in all sphere of its activities.

The B.K. brothers and sisters

would express their innermost feelings before Dadiji and she used to listen to them with rapt attention. She used to give her decision instantly. She certainly had a soft corner for kumars, understood their problems and gave appropriate solutions. Many programmes of deep meditation for kumars would specially be arranged so that they could take maximum spiritual benefit. It was certainly because of her care and concern for kumars that she was called Kumarka Dadi. I feel that it is because of Dadiji that we could follow this path of Rajyoga smoothly for such a long time. I always felt myself very close to Dadiji.

When Dadiji visited Kurukshetra, I had an opportunity to attend to her. She had keen interest in cultural heritage of India and she made it a point to visit Jyotisar, near Kurukshetra, which is believed to be the holy place where Geeta Gyan was spoken for the benefit of mankind. She also met the purohit there and discussed spiritual knowledge with him. Once I went to Mount Abu to discuss some personal matter. Dadiji very carefully listened to me, gave her free and frank suggestions and offered to me that I could come and stay in Madhuban whenever I wanted and for as long as I wished. Thereafter also I got opportunity to meet her on a number of occasions and got inspiration to move fast on this spiritual path.

Her commitment and dedication got global recognition in the service of humanity and spirituality. In 1984 she was awarded a UN Peace Medal for services rendered for world peace. She was also awarded honorary Doctor of Literature Degree by Mohan Lal Sukhadia University, Udaipur, India for her outstanding contribution in the field of moral and spiritual education. She served as one of the Presidents of the Parliament of World's Religions convened in 1993.

On 25th August 2007, Dadi Prakashmani breathed her last. Prakash Stambh built in her memory in Shantivan Complex, Abu Road reminds us of her love and affection, care and concern for humanity. Dadi Prakashmani will always be remembered as a strong pillar of spirituality, universal harmony and fraternity. On this forthcoming anniversary of Dadi ji on 25th August, let's pledge to work for spreading positive vibrations to all souls of the world.


Once I was invited to attend the Kumbh fair held at Ujjain. I visited the fair together with other Sanyasis. The tents of the sanyasi clans were spread over large area there. Everyone was competing in showing-off his power by spending huge amount of money. As the Shipra river had dried completely, it was filled with water through pipeline and it looked like a nice lake. Everyone was supposed

to take a "Holy Dip of Kumbh" at that place to earn good fortune. On the day of main celebration, I witnessed confrontation among the top most Sanyasis of different clans for becoming the first one to take the holy dip. I felt very sad after witnessing this scene. I was embarrassed even more when I saw most of the Sanyasis taking the holy dip in a completely naked state. I was

> sure that one couldn't meet God through all these things. Thereafter, Ι visited Mahakaleshwar and Omkareshwar and, then returned to my ashram. After seeing the strange conduct and activities of the

so called protectors of religion, I didn't like this path. I silently started praying to God saying, "Oh God, however You are, whether in a physical form or in incorporeal form, please enlighten me, and show me the right path, the path of truth..." Then I decided to leave the ashram, and do Tapasva in Himalayas. I prayed to God to show me the true path as I was no more interested in leading that sort of life.

It is true that sanyasis get lot of respect from their devotees and followers; highly established people, political leaders, ministers and government officers bow to them, but, they can't share their dilemma with anyone. My confusion was further increased by reading scriptures because they greatly differ about God, soul and other spiritual matters. The main activity in our ashram was to read the Gita everyday. But, I was not able to understand what the truth was! Somewhere God says that He doesn't take birth; and and at another place He says that He exists in the form of Banyan tree, the river Ganga or in the form of the Sage Kapil. Also, elsewhere God says that He lives in a place which is beyond the physical limits of Moon, Sun and stars and where their physical light also cannot reach... and

somewhere He says that He is omnipresent. I also noted many other contradictions. The sanyasis had to live in that state of ambiguity against their wish and they also had to keep the devotees in that confusion. Else. if they themselves exposed their confusion, then the devotees would no more respect them. Then how would their ashrams run? I used to ask many famous Sanyasis about their personal experience whether they had met God or if they had attained mental peace in their lives? Almost all of them used to answer that they were still searching for Him. I found them busy in criticizing others and proving that their path was the best. Some of the senior sanyasis also suggested me to join their groups. I found conflict in every corner; none was free from the five vices-Lust, Anger, Greed, Ego and Attachment. It seemed as if the contemporary religion was standing on the support of external show-off. I continued performing services in the ashram with all these confusions in mind. Around the same time, a highly learned, elderly and saintly person came to visit our Ashram. He had the degrees of MBBS and FRCS in Medicine. Besides, he had also attained the Degree of Ayurvedacharya. He had also memorised all the Sanskrit shlokas of Vedas and other scriptures. He was a great devotee of Sri Krishna. He celebrated his birthday in our ashram among thousands of devotees. Thereafter, I met him in private and discussed about my problems and queries. On listening to those, he started criticising my Guru and suggested me to become his disciple. I couldn't sleep that night and whole night kept remembering and praying to my Guru that, being my Spiritual Teacher, he must come in front of me, and show me the right path to God; else the next morning I would leave him and beome the disciple of Dr. Shivananda Goswamiji. But my prayers didn't get any result. So, the next morning secretly I became the disciple of Shivananda Goswamiji and requested him to keep this news confidential. He shared his experience that he had travelled throughout the World but couldn't meet God anywhere. So, he advised to consider every human being as Narayan (the highest deity) and respect all.

He ordered me to leave that ashram and I agreed to do so. I started preparing to leave the place. But at that time I had been feeling strong pain in my right leg and waist for some time due to which moving around had become difficult. I had undergone various types of treatments, but nothing helped. Seeing my plight, my brother advised me to read an article in Gyanamrit, a Hindi magazine published by the Brahma Kumaris organisation, for removing pain through Rajyoga Meditation and Magnet Therapy. After reading the article, I decided to visit Mt. Abu with my brother to try out that treatment too. My mother and brother had been following the teachings of Brahma Kumaris Ishwariya Vishwa Vidyalaya for a few years. They used to arrange the visit of Brahma Kumari sisters to our ashram from time to time, so that I could take interest in Godly knowledge. But, I never listened to them. This knowledge seemed to be completely opposite to the path of devotion. My intellect couldn't accept this new knowledge. As a result, I had become averse to the Brahma Kumaris. I didn't even like someone praising them. But, as my visit to Mt. Abu was being finalised, during my prayer in the ashram, I had a vision of Brahma Baba inviting me with his open arms. It was a beautiful experience as if Brahma Baba was standing right in front of me

and the entire place was filled with golden red light and I could see everything through my open eyes. I liked this experience very much and as a result, my respect and faith towards the institution began to develop.

Finally, I left for Mt. Abu with my brother and reached the beautiful complex of Shantivan. We stayed there and the next day, we reached the Global Hospital at Mount Abu. Brahma Kumar Anil who has been serving there was familiar to us since he too hails from the same place as we do. He made all arrangements for my spiritual treatment, apart from physical treatment. I was introduced to Dr. Srimant Sahoo. I had a strong ego of my Saffron dress. Therefore, I didn't take interest in listening the spiritual knowledge and refused to take the introductory course. But I was so much impressed by amiable nature and humility of Dr. Srimant ji that gradually I started listening to the ideology of the Brahma Kumaris. I used to ask many questions in the beginning. His logical answers increased my curiosity in this knowledge. After taking lessons in Rajyoga for three days, I started believing that this knowledge is definitely being given by God Himself and this is the true knowledge which I have been searching for throughout my life. The thought, "Oh God, finally I have found you... and from a devotee, you have made me your child" came repeatedly in my mind. I got the answers to all my questions and my thirst for knowledge was finally quenched. I started feeling the saffron dress of a sanyasi as a show-off. I could wait no more. And one day I silently went to the market, without telling anyone. At a barber's shop, I got my hair cut and shaved my beard which had grown over last few years. Then I bought a set of white dress and wore it. Wearing the normal dress of a Brahma Kumar, when I looked in the mirror, I initially couldn't recognise myself. In the evening, when Dr. Shrimant came to discuss the knowledge with me, even he couldn't recognise me. After sometime when he recognised me, he felt very happy. But he suggested that I should remain in the saffron dress for some more time so that I could spread the Godly knowledge and spiritual message among other sanyasis after returning to the ashram. But, I was determined to be a real child of God and follow His Shrimat completely. I said that if I continued to live in the ashram like a sanyasi, I'd have

to disobey God's Shrimat of eating pure food. It was so because none of the sanyasis used to cook in the Ashram as the cooking work was usually done by the servants who were householders.. Thus the first disobedience of Shrimat was likely to happen in the intake of pure food. Every activity in the ashram was based on bodyconsciousness, e.g., the worship of the guru, which is also body-consciousness. How far could I avoid confrontation with them if I decided to live with them? Since now I had found what I had been searching for so long; it was desirable for me to give up sanyas.

Finally, those fortunate moments too came for me when I met BapDada (the Supreme Soul, incorporeal God Shiva and Brahma Baba in combined form) through the medium of Rajyogini Dadi Hriday Mohini ji. When Dadiji went into trance, I couldn't see her physical body. I could clearly see Brahma Baba seated there. And then I could see a bright source of light, spreading its powerful rays. I kept looking at it for a long time. That was the time when I was experiencing the stage of complete bodilessness . I was in the blissful stage of meeting God, the experience so much

sought after by me. It was the first time in my life when I experienced the real state of bliss. I considered myself very fortunate since I could finally meet God whom the entire world is searching for.

Full to the brim with the love of God and His divine family, I didn't feel like leaving Baba's home. But, I had to leave. I reached my ashram where all inmates were highly surprised to see me in white dress and without any beard. They started asking hundreds of questions. They were not ready to listen or understand anything I tried to say. In their view, I had committed an unpardonable crime by wearing white dress and cutting the beard. They started looking down upon me; some even humiliated me by saying derogatory words. This was a moment of huge test for me because a sanyasi who used to get lot of respect was now being humiliated openly by everyone around. I just kept silently remembering my dearest Shiv Baba. Finally I said to them, "Whatever you may say, I have finally found God whom I had been searching for in my life. Now I have decided to leave the ashram by handling over all the responsibilities to you all. Please liberate me from here."

For a second, everyone was

dumbstruck on listening to my decision. As I was .leaving the place, many of the sanyasis and devotee mothers and sisters had tears in their eyes. But, I was determined to live a life based totally on Baba's shrimat. My part of bhakti was over and now I had attained God as the fruit of my devotion. As I came back to my home, I found that many of my relatives and neighbours had already started gathering there. Those poor souls were unaware of this Godly knowledge and so they too were misunderstanding me. Many of them even rebuked me. I considered these things as test papers for me and kept my faith unshaken. Soon some of the relatives came up with marriage proposals and started troubling me. On the other hand, since the ashram was close to my home, everyday people would pressurize me to return to the Ashram. At times a thought came to my mind that since the people in the ashram were calling me back, why should I not go and live there as per Baba's shrimat? But, I kept visiting the local B.K. Centre everyday and listening to Baba's Murli. On listening to Godly versions, soon all my thoughts waste were overcome. Now the heart keeps humming the song, "Even if the world tries millions of times. I

will never leave Your hand". Now I am leading a surrendered life at the International Headquarters of the Brahma Kumaris organisation, as a fullfledged child of Baba, an everhappy Brahma Kumar.

being burnt or destroyed due to various other reasons, including deterioration due to rains etc.. It is because of the absence or lack of these qualities of the heart that when millions of children in many parts of the world, urgently require food and are in great need of the means of education, the advanced countries are manufacturing bombs, rather than sending to them baby foods, and are making missiles rather than medicines.

Need for Revolution in Man's Relationship

There is, therefore, need for a revolution, which awakens in our mind a kind of feeling that one great family and have relationships of brothers and sisters among us. We must look after and care for each other. We can't live alone as an isolated island in an ocean. We are social beings and our sense of social justice and of being a good citizen depends upon our understanding of what relationships we have among ourselves. Our condition is not going to improve if only the love is in short supply. We must not forget that man cannot live by bread alone; he needs love and wants to express love, and it is this aspect of man's being which needs to be revolutionized.

Rakhi for a New Revolution

'Rakhi' has the potentialities of such a new revolution. Though it is only a piece of thread to look at, the spirit and the understanding with which it is tied have, indeed, seeds of a great revolution. A piece of wire has, ordinarily, no power but when an electric current runs through it, it can be used to set big wheels of a giant machine in motion. Likewise, the kind of love and the knowledge which Rakhi carries with it has more power than any other power man has for transforming a human heart. Hence, 'Rakhi' is a unique festival. The sight of sister tying Rakhi to a brother not only stirs a feeling of love and the recollection of the family bond of affection between a sister and a brother but it awakens in the mind of every spectator also the feeling of pure and universal love. If a person, who is witnessing this sight, has no sister, he would say, heaving a deep sigh: "I wish that I also had sister who would have tied a Rakhi around my wrist today." A girl who does not have a brother and boy who does not have a sister feel what a great thing it is in life to have a brother or a sister. Every brother and sister considers this day as one of the most auspicious days and this kind of love as more refreshing. Therefore, we say that 'Rakhi' which is celebrated by tying a piece of thread and by applying a tilak - sandal or a saffron mark on the forehead - can transform the relationship between human beings.

Love in our Relationship is Necessary for Peace

We should remember that our peace and happiness are linked to our mutual relationships. If there is hatred, jealousy, feeling of vengeance, selfishness, bitterness or estrangement in our relationships, we cannot feel peaceful. It is only when there is love, amity, cooperation, consideration, attitude of help, understanding, feeling of kinship, the motive to share and the attitude of helping each other that we feel happy and we think that life is worth living. But these are the values, the feelings or the human qualities, which no industrial, agricultural or political revolution can bring about. It is only such a sociospiritual celebration as the Raksha Bandhan that can bring change in human hearts. 'Raksha Bandhan' is an occasion not merely for gala ceremonies or festivities but for renewing and reawakening these qualities of ours, and restrengthening these holy bonds.

Goodwill and Love are Our Best Protection and Security

We must bear it in mind that we may have the mightiest of weapons and greatest of armies, the most experienced of all generals, the most brilliant scientists who can give us newer and newer means of protecting ourselves and destroying our enemy, but no one can be sure that these would work as an unbreakable defence system and impenetrable means of protection. Let us remember, therefore, that there is no greater security than that which lies in goodwill and friendship. One cannot disarm nations by diplomatic negotiations or by passing resolutions but only by extending one's hand of amity to those whom one has been looking at as one's adversary. So, let us make preparations to kill the enmity rather than the enemies, to destroy the weapons rather than destroy the segments of society with weapons. All this requires a revolutionary change in heart, a change in relationships, and Raksha Bandhan can bring about this change.

May the whole world - not India alone - celebrate 'Raksha Bandhan' in this spirit!
