

BK Golo receiving Lifetime Achievement Award Jaipur – 13.3.2026




SKIT – Swami Keshvanand Institute of Technology, Management and Gramothan, Jaipur:

It is a great honour for us to recognise an eminent personality whose lifelong work has significantly contributed to renewable energy, sustainability and global environmental awareness.

We are privileged to honour Golo J. Pilz, Adviser of Renewable Energy to the Brahma Kumaris, Mount Abu. An experienced meditation teacher and global speaker, he has travelled to more than 75 countries, advocating for sustainable solutions through an ethical, value-based approach. He founded IndiaCare Trust in 1989, supporting numerous medical and scientific initiatives in India. He also played a key role in pioneering renewable energy projects, including India One Solar Thermal Power Plant, a landmark 1 MW solar thermal project developed with collaboration between the Indian and German Governments.

The honourable Chairman, Shri Jaipal Ji Meel presented Golo with the **LifeTime Achievement Award for Outstanding Contributions to Renewable Energy in Rajasthan.**

Golo also gave a keynote speech and presentation at the 2-day conference at the SKIT Institute. He emphasised that faith, ethics and technology have to go together in innovations for the future. Then, renewable energy is no longer a technical project - it becomes a spiritual expression of respect for life



Golo also participated in a panel discussion on renewable energy and sustainability. He emphasized the importance of always considering the common good and integrating long-standing spiritual and ethical principles—such as peace and compassion—into all projects. He highlighted that only beneficial technologies should be introduced and that spirituality can help bring well-tested ethical principles back into society and governance.

The International Big Cat Alliance (IBCA) is a global coalition launched by India in April 2023 to conserve seven major big cat species: Tiger, Lion, Leopard, Snow Leopard, Cheetah, Jaguar, and Puma. Headquartered in India, it facilitates collaboration among 95+ countries and partners to stop habitat loss, combat poaching, and share conservation expertise. We met Director S.P. In the lush Habitat Centre in New Delhi, we met our friend Ms Vibha Dawan, Director of **TERI The Energy and Resources Institute**. We discussed the upcoming climate conference and a possible joint side event with TERI.



We also met with **GRIHA - Green Rating for Integrated Habitat Assessment** and its Director, Sanjay Seth, and Mr Akash Deep. The plan is to begin with a pilot project and conduct an energy audit of the Solar House at Gyan Sarovar. At a later stage, additional Brahma Kumaris buildings may be assessed, rated, and certified.

The last visit was to **The Coalition for Disaster Resilient Infrastructure (CDRI)**, whose primary focus is on developing disaster-resilience in ecological, social, and economic infrastructure. We met Advocacy Director David White and advocacy specialist Kopal Verma for a fruitful discussion. We plan to invite them to the next live studio sessions at COP31 in Antalya, Turkey.
